

Tuesday Sept 22-1875

Lat 26.05³ First part of this day moderate breezes
Long 176.12^W from the N. Weather good. Ship working
to the N. middle and Latter parts the
same. Saw nothing. Employed in the
rigging and so ends this day.

Wednesday Sept 23

Lat 26.28³ First part of this day strong breezes
Long 176.34^W from the N. Weather squally. middle
and Latter parts the same. Started
water. Saw several fin backs at sun
down took in all sail to lower main
top sail and so ends this day.

Thursday Sept 24

Lat 27.04³ First part of this day blowing a gale
Long 176.54^W from the S.E. Weather squally. Ship head-
ing S.W. middle and Latter parts
the same. Saw several fin backs.
Employed generally and so ends.

Friday Sept 25

Lat 26.20³ First part of this day moderate breezes
Long 178.01^W from the S.E. Weather good. Ship working
to the S.W. middle and Latter parts the
same. Saw fin backs. Employed generally
and so ends this day.

Saturday Sept 26

First part of this day good breezes from
the N.E. Weather thick with rain. Ship
steering N.W. under all sail. Middle
and Latter parts the same. Saw fin backs.
Repaired the main sail with the top mast
studd sail. Wet hold and so ends this day.

Sunday Sept 27-1875

Lat 26.25³ First part of this day light breezes from
Long 178.07^W the S. Weather fine. Ship heading N.W.
middle part the same. Latter part strong
breezes from the S.E. steering N.W. about
3 P.M. raised something lowered the waist
boat and went to it it proved to be sea
foam. Peter Enos returned to duty so ends.

Monday Sept 28

Lat 26.04³ First part of this day moderate breezes
Long 178.23^W from the S. Weather good. middle and
Latter parts wind from the E. Ship steer-
ing N.W. Saw nothing. Started water.
Employed generally and so ends this day.

Tuesday Sept 29

Lat 26.20³ First part of this day light breezes from the
Long 176.55^W N.E. Weather fine. Ship steering S.W. by N. mid-
dle and Latter parts the same. Saw nothing.
Employed in making new black straps
and covering them to all the blocks. Repaired
the fore gallant sail. Captain turning be-
laying pine and so ends this day.

Wednesday Sept 30

First part of this day light breezes from the
N.E. Fine weather. Ship steering S.W. by N.
middle and Latter parts wind hauling to
the Westward. Saw porpoise and one fin
back. Employed generally. Carpenter making
a new hatch for the fore castle. Captain tur-
ning belaying pine. Started beef. Sugar. Coffee
and flour. and so ends this day.
