Monday May 30th 1881

This day good breeze from the S.W. all
sail out. ship steering E by S. saw one
sulphur bottom men employed in the
rigging so ends this day.

Lat-40.2
Long 56.45

Tuesday May 31st

This day light breeze from the S.W.
ship steering E by N. men employed
generally saw one sail, and picked
up a long spar. so ends this day.

Lat-41.12
Long 55.00

Wednesday June 1st

This day fine weather, with light
breeze from the S.W. ship steering
E by N all sail out, saw a large
ocean steamer steering to the S.E.
men employed generally, so ends.

Thursday June 2nd

This day very light breeze from
the S.E. ship on the wind working
to the Eastward with thick fog
nothing been seen so ends.

Friday June 3rd

This day heavy rain and thick
fog with baffling wind ship on
opposite tack trying to get to the
Eastward, nothing been seen. no
observation so ends this day.
