

Lat-39.4 Sunday. Aug 21st/1881
Long 41.33 This day moderate breeze from the N. ship steering E saw several sails a turtle and I believe that is all so ends this day.

Lat-39.15 Monday Aug 22nd
Long 39.53 This day calm and light air saw one sail, a french bark from France lowered down the Larboard boat and inquired his longitude it compared with ours exactly also saw porpoises nothing in the whale line to write so ends this day.

Lat-38.84 Tuesday. Aug 23rd
Long 39.00 This day very light-breeze from the N. ship steering S by E. weather fine nothing been seen except jumpers and grampas. no whales. so ends this day.

Lat-37.49 Wednesday. Aug 24th
Long 38.18 This day very light-breeze from the N ship steering S by E & E. weather fine and very hot. saw two large pieces of squid and passed a boat-called it a merchant ships boat; it was bottom up. men been employed setting up main rigging so ends this day.

Lat-37.1 Thursday. Aug 25th
Long 37.28 This day good weather with light breeze from the N by E ship steering S by E & E. saw grampas killers and caught a fish men employed generally so ends.

Lat-36.20 Friday Aug 26th/1881
Long 36.37 This day good weather with light-breeze from the E ship stood on opposite tacks saw nothing except grampas and porpoise so ends.

Lat-36.38 Saturday Aug 27th
Long 36.9. This day very light-breeze from the N S W. ship on the wind working to the N. weather fine. saw three sails killers grampas and fish. but no whales so ends an other day.

Lat-37.2 Sunday. Aug 28th
Long 37.10 This day fine weather with light breeze from the N N W. ship steering N N E. saw several sails porpoises grampas &c. but no whales. so ends this day.

Lat-37.52 Monday Aug 29th
Long 37.14 This day first-part light-breeze from the N. ship on the wind working to the N and N. middle and latter part steering E N E. about 6 AM raised spouts called them sperm whales and lowered the boats for them but they proved to be killers. about 10 AM spoke the bark Wave Capt. Briggs came on board he is two years out 700 lbs all told so ends.

Lat-38.37 Tuesday. Aug 30th
Long 34.59 This day strong breeze from the N ship steering E S E weather squally just before dark signalized an English merchant-ship steering to the E nothing more been seen so ends.
