Saturday

Oct 8th 1881

Long 20.53. This day light-breezes from the S.E. ship on the wind heading S.W. saw grampas. weather very hot. so ends.

Sunday.

Oct 9th

This day very light-breezes from the E.S.E. ship steering S by N.W. weather very hot. nothing been seen except a few fish so ends this day.

Lat-9.37

Monday.

Oct 10th

Long 21.22 This day light-air from the N.W. ship steering S by N. saw grampas and porpoise, weather very hot.

Lat-8.21

Tuesday.

Oct 11th

Long 21.20 This day light-breezes from the E. with frequent rain squalls. ship steering S by N. about 10 o'clock raised a whale called it a sperm whale and lowered three boats. but it proved to be a finback. he spouted seventeen times so ends.

Lat-7.57

Wednesday.

Oct 12th

Long 21.17 This day a dead calm ship going round and round saw grampas. weather very hot so ends this day.

Lat-7.40

Thursday.

Oct 13th

Long 21.17 This day a calm. ship makes very little head way. saw blackfish and grampas employed sheathing the deck so ends.

Friday

Oct 14th

Lat 7.19 This day a calm. ship trying to get to the South. saw blackfish and grampas. men employed sheathing deck so ends.

Lat-6.55

Saturday

Oct 15th 1881

Long 21.53

This day light-air and calms ship on the port tack all sail out saw blackfish and lowered the boats for them but did not get any employed sheathing deck so ends.

Sunday

Oct 16th

Lat-6.36

Long 21.28

This day light-breezes from the S.W. ship on the wind heading S.E. nothing been seen. the day ends with rain squalls. Oct 17th

Monday.

First part of this day light-breeze from the S.W. ship on the wind middle part wind hauled into the N with heavy rain ship steering S.W. latter part the same wind very light. nothing been seen and no observation so ends.

Lat-5.50

Tuesday.

Oct 18th

Long 19.47

This day light-air and calms ship scarcely moves. saw grampas and fish and one shark so ends.

Wednesday

Oct 19th

This day strong breezes and squally weather with heavy rain. wind from the S. ship on the wind heading N.S.W. no observation.

Thursday

Oct 20th

Lat 4.36

Long 21.4

This day light-breezes from the S by N ship on the wind heading N.S.W. saw one sail so ends.
