

Lat-36. 42

Saturday Dec 17th 1881,

Long 9. 46 This day blowing strong from the W by N. ship on the wind heading S W by S under short-sail. about 1 O'clock Mr Wyman raised two right-whales going to the windward did not lower it was so rugged, commenced to boil about 3 P.M. saw only number of fin backs and birds so ends.

Lat-36. 43

Sunday, Dec 18th

Long 9. 53 First and middle part of this day very light-breezes from the W N W. latter part strong breeze ship stood on spails. Lacks about 10 o'clock Mr Wyman raised a right-whale three miles on weather beam going to the windward lowered the Starboard Starboard & Bow boats without success, employed boiling so ends.

Lat-37. 6

Monday, Dec 19th

Long 9. 36 This day fine weather with moderate breezes from the N N W. ship working to the W, about 12 M. George the boat-stener raised a right-whale lowered the Starboard, Starboard, and Bow boats and the Starboard boat struck took him along side about 1 P.M. about 4 P.M. the cook raised right-whales lowered the Starboard and waist-boats and the waist-boat struck took him along side about 5 P.M. and let him lay cut in the first one got through about 7 O'clock and got supper set the watch, employed boiling so ends. broke out flour

Lat-37. 12

Tuesday, Dec 20th 1881,

This day moderate breeze from the N W. weather thick and muggy, at day light commenced to cut in the other whale got through about 11 O'clock and went to stowing down oil got through late they finished boiling last night, the whale turned up 132 lbs. so ends this day.

Lat-37. 11

Wednesday, Dec 21st

Long 9. 57

This day fine weather with wind from the N N W. ship cruising, about 12 M. George the boat-stener raised right-whales two lowered the Starboard Starboard & Waist-boats and the Starboard boat struck took him along side about 4 O'clock and let him lay for the night got every thing ready to cut and set the watch employed boiling Mr Sayer killed the whale so ends this day.

Lat-37. 11

Thursday, Dec 22nd

Long 10. 33

First part of this day strong breeze from the N W. middle and latter part blowing very hard, about 4 O'clock commenced to cut got through about 2 P.M. about 1 O'clock saw four right-whales, did not lower it was so rugged employed boiling so ends.

Lat-37. 3

Friday, Dec 23rd

Long 10. 57

This day strong breezes from the N W ship on the Starboard tack heading N S W. weather very thick and foggy, nothing been seen to day, employed boiling and stowing oil, so ends.

Lat-37. 40

Saturday, Dec 24th

Long 10. 42

This day strong breeze from the W weather thick and foggy, ship working to the N W. employed boiling nothing been seen so ends
