

Lat-37.32 Sunday Feb 5th 1882

Long 53.18 This day light breeze from the E S E. ship on the wind heading S. weather fine saw one sail nothing to write so ends.

Lat-38.22 Monday Feb 6th

Long 53.46 This day very light breeze from the N W. ship steering S E all sail out, took the bow out to dry. saw grampas & albacore

Lat-38.31 Tuesday Feb 7th

Long 56.17 This day moderate breeze from the W N W. ship steering S E employed bundling the tone got through about noon. bundled 3110 lbs. took the stern boat off the house to repair saw one sail and grampas.

Lat-38.32 Wednesday Feb 8th

Long 58.19 This day very light breeze from the S E ship on the wind working to the N S E. employed mending the waist-boat. nothing been seen so ends this day.

Lat-38.13 Thursday Feb 9th

Long 57.52 This day fine weather with light breeze from the E ship on the wind heading S S E. spoke the English Barguinein from Bell Capt. Crosbie, fifteen days from Mauritius bound to Robert-town loaded with sugar had his wife on board. saw fin back still employed repairing the boat so ends

Lat-38.13 Friday Feb 10th

Long 61.18 This day light breeze from the S E ship steering S E all sail out finished the waist-boat and put it out and took in the bow boat to repair nothing been seen except birds so ends.

Lat-39.42 Saturday Feb 11th 1882

Long 63.12 This day light breeze from the N W. ship steering S E by E. finished the bow boat and put it on the cranes killed a pig, nothing been seen.

Lat-39.58 Sunday Feb 12th

Long 66.2 This day moderate breeze from the S W. ship steering S E all sail out nothing been seen except two fin backs and birds.

Lat-40.25 Monday Feb 13th

Long 68.29 This day light breeze from the W N W. ship steering S E by E S E. all sail out, weather thick part of the day, employed mending the Starboard boat, nothing been seen, so ends.

Lat-40.30 Tuesday Feb 14th

Long 72.25 This day strong breeze from the N by W. ship steering E S E. about 1 P.M. John boatmen raised a sperm whale towed two boats and chased until night but without success spoke the bark Moberley last from Cape Town bound to New Zealand, compared longitudes they agreed within six miles so ends, also saw one right-whale.

Lat-40.27 Wednesday Feb 15th

Long 76.27 This day blowing strong from the N N W. ship steering E S E. weather thick and raining finished the starboard boat and put it out saw killies so ends this day.

Lat-40.17 Thursday Feb 16th

Long 81.21 This day blowing very hard from the W. ship steering E S E weather squally, nothing been seen to day except gonyx and nothing to write about, so ends this day.
