These 24 hours fine weather and good breeze from NNW at 11 A.M. spoke Bark Robert-Morrison Capt Mosher two years out 750 all told also saw French Rock and a mother sail cutting 20 ends.

Wednesday

Apr 12

These 24 hours fine weather and breeze from NNW at 6 A.M. Mr. Cook raised sperm whales lowered and struck two one ^{was} the, drewed the other after he was dead the iron came out and he sunk lost both. Hard times. Saw two sails.

Thursday

Apr 13

These 24 hours light air and calm Saw nothing. Steering NNW 20 ends.

Friday

Apr 14

These 24 hours good breeze from E at day light. Joe Boatsteerer raised sperm whales going NW lowered four boats and the bow boat struck got him alongside before dark and Goat Island and Curtis Rocks in sight.

Saturday

Apr 15

These 24 hours fine breeze from E at day commenced to cut finished at 11 A.M. at 1 P.M. Mr. Cook raised sperm whales off Curtis Rocks lowered and got one to the waist boat.

Sunday

Apr 16

These 24 hours good weather but in the whale and started the works spoke Capt Mosher boiling 100 barrels. Saw the Rocks and Goat Island 20 ends.

Monday

Apr 17

These 24 hours strong breeze cruising around the Islands still boiling.

Tuesday

Apr 18

These 24 hours moderate breeze cruising around Goat Island finished boiling turned up 108 bar.

Wednesday

Apr 19

These 24 hours strong breeze stowed part of the oil at noon George Vincent raised sperm whales lowered four boats got none whales going NE. Saw Sunday and Goat Islands and Curtis Rocks.

Thursday

Apr 20

These 24 hours strong breeze from N with rain. finished stowing. Saw Goat Island bearing NNW 20 ends.

Friday

Apr 21

These 24 hours blowing strong from SE at 6 1/2 A.M. John Boatsteerer raised sperm whales going SW lowered three boats and got two one to the larboard and one to the waist boat cut one in before dark saw Goat and Curtis Rocks bearing to the Westward.
