

Saturday Apr 22/82

These 24 hours strong breeze from S.E. At day light cut in the other whale and started the works Cruising to the Eastward of the Island and Rocks which are in sight. Saw one merchantman so ends.

Sunday Apr 23

These 24 hours strong breeze from E.S.E. Finished boiling about 2 P.M. At 2 1/2 P.M. Mr. Wyman raised sperm whales going about N Ship bearing about E by N from Curtis Rocks. Lowered four boats and the larboard boat struck got him along side before dark the other boats chased until dark with out success. Saw Goat Island and so ends.

Monday Apr 24

These 24 hours moderate breeze from S.S.E. at day light went to cutting finished at 8 1/2 A.M. started the works at noon. Saw Goat and Sunday Islands and so ends.

Tuesday Apr 25

These 24 hours strong breeze and squally. Finished boiling at day light. Turned up 30 barrels Employed stowing down. At 9 A.M. Joe raised spouts at 1 P.M. John Boatsteerer raised sperm whales lower four boats and got two. Larboard & Starboard boats one each. Saw Goat Island bearing N.W. about 15 miles off.

Wednesday Apr 26/82

These 24 hours fine weather with the wind from E. cut in our whale Goat Island & Sunday Island in sight started the try works, one sail in sight.

Thursday Apr 27th

First part strong breeze from the N.E. at 1 A.M. raised a school of sperm whales lowered all four boats and got three whales one to the Larboard Starboard & Waist boats got our whales along side and cut one in latter part strong breeze. saw one whale and Goat Island so ends.

Friday Apr 28th

First part strong breeze from the N.E. at day light commenced to cut got them both cut in and started the works cleared away the heads, saw another whaler cutting, so ends this day.

Saturday Apr 29th

First part of this day blowing strong from N.W. to N. ship on port tack boiling what we can, latter part more moderate with rain in squalls, wind from N to N.W. so ends.

Sunday Apr 30th

First part moderate winds from the N. ship on opposite tacks, latter part wind from the S.W. finished boiling so ends.

Monday May 1st

First part fine light winds from S.W. latter part wind from E to N. employed stowing oil between decks, spoke the Adeline Gibbs Capt. Reed. with 650 bl of oil all sold.

Whales turned up 55 barrels.
