

Lat 31-8

Tuesday

May 2nd 1882.

First part strong breeze from the N with rain, ship on the port tack. Latter part moderate winds from the N. so ends this day.

Wednesday

May 3rd

First part fine weather with the wind from the S.W. ship on opposite tacks. Latter part fine employed stowing oil in after hold, gannet the Robert Morrison Capt. Mosher. so ends this day.

Thursday

May 4th

First part weather fine wind from the S.W. ship on port tack, three whales in sight. Latter part fine wind from the S.W. gannet the James Arnold Capt. Chase. Goat Island in sight.

Friday

May 5th

First part fine weather wind from the N.W. ship on different tacks. Latter part the same, three whales in sight also Goat Island so ends.

Saturday

May 6th

First part strong breeze from the N. at 6 A.M. raised whale and lowered three boats whale going quick to windward the Robert Morrison came down from the windward and got three, the James Arnold & Adaline Gibbs all had their boats down but got none, boats got aboard about 4 P.M. gannet the A Gibbs & James Arnold Mr. Kingo had a whale missed to day hope to have better luck next time

Sunday.

May 7th 1882.

First part strong breeze from the N.W. middle and latter part the same ship on opposite tacks Goat Island and three whales in sight so ends.

Monday

May 8th

First part a calm Goat Island and Sunday Island in sight and one whale boiling latter part light air from N.W. ship on different tacks.

Tuesday

May 9th

First part strong breeze from N.W. ship on opposite tacks Goat Island and Curtis rocks in sight also three whales. Latter part the same, stood up to the westward between G. Island & Curtis rocks in company with the James Arnold gannet so ends this day.

Wednesday

May 10th

First part a calm, middle and latter part the same most of the time, at 2 P.M. lowered four boats and towed off from a reef laying S.E. four miles from Curtis rocks it broke open.

Thursday

May 11th

First part light air from the N.W. course S. latter part a calm most of the time Goat Island & Curtis rocks in sight all day so ends.

Friday

May 12th

First part strong breeze from N.W. ship on starboard tack, latter part blowing strong from N. nothing been seen to day
