Tuesday, Aug 1st 1882.

First-part-fine wind light-SE. ship on port tack latter part-fine wind ESE at sundown shortened sail so ends.

Lat-25.6

Wednesday, Aug 2nd

First-part-strong breezes from ESE wore ship at 6 A.M. at 8 A.M. raised a school of sperm whales. lowered four boats and the L. aboard boat struck. got the whale along side and cut the body in blowing strong so ends this day.

Thursday, Aug 3rd

First-part-blowing strong from NW. at 10. wind changed into the SW. tried to cut but it was too rugged. middle and latter part the same. started the works

Friday, Aug 4th

Strong breezes from the SW. cut in the remainder of our whale middle and latter part the same. boiling

Lat-24.30

Long 168.22

Saturday, Aug 5th

Wind from the SW. with heavy swell and rugged middle and latter part the same. finished boiling the whale turned up 84 bls.

Long 168.49

Sunday, Aug 6th

Strong breeze and rugged weather wind SW. ship cruising

Lat-25.15

Long 168.25

Monday, Aug 7th

Moderate winds from the N. ship on opposite tacks middle and latter part the same employed stowing oil so ends

Lat-24.42

Long 168.40

Tuesday, Aug 8th 1882

First-part-wind from the NW. ship on opposite tacks middle and latter part rain repaired the fly jib

Wednesday, Aug 9th

Lat-25.11

Long 168.41

This day wind from SW. with rain squalls ship on port tack middle and latter part the same. repaired lower main top sail.

Lat-24.46

Long 168.16

Thursday, Aug 10th

Light winds from the S. ship on the port tack by the wind middle and latter part the same. saw fin back

Lat-24.47

Long 167.43

Friday, Aug 11th

This day good weather wind from the SW. ship on the wind employed repairing fore gallant sail saw hump backs.

Lat-24.00

Long 166.47

Saturday, Aug 12th

This day good breeze from the SW. ship on the wind on opposite tacks cruising saw junks employed mending fore stay sail

Lat-24.55

Long 167.55

Sunday, Aug 13th

First-part of this day strong breezes from the N. middle and latter part the same with rain, ship steering S under short sail saw hump backs.

Lat-25.11

Long 167.11

Monday, Aug 14th

First and middle part of this day very strong breeze from the NW. ship on the wind about 8 A.M. Mr. Wymann raised sperm whales going quick to windward did not lower worked the ship to windward but could not gain on them, latter part blowing very heavy.
