Wednesday.

Aug 16th

This day strong breezes from the S weather squally ship on the wind on opposite tacks nothing been seen.

Thursday.

Aug 17th

This day moderate breezes from the S S. ship on the wind heading S.W. saw one fin back men employed in the rigging, so ends this day.

Friday

Aug 18th

This day moderate breezes from the E. first and middle part steering S latter part on the wind men employed in the rigging nothing been seen.

Saturday

Aug 19th

This day good breezes from the N. ship on the wind looking hard for a whale, saw several fin backs.

Sunday

Aug 20th

This day strong breezes from the E ship on opposite tacks saw fin backs and porpoises

Monday

Aug 21st

This day strong breezes from the E and heavy rain storm ship on opposite tacks nothing been seen.

Tuesday.

Aug 22nd 1852

This day strong breeze with very heavy rain from the E S. nothing been seen and no observation.

Wednesday.

Aug 23rd

This day weather more moderate ship on the wind, wind from the S. nothing been seen to day so ends.

Thursday.

Aug 24th

This day blowing strong from the S. ship on the starboard tack working to the N. at sundown shortened sail and wore ship saw grampus so ends.

Friday

Aug 25th

This day strong breezes and squally weather from the S S. ship on the wind looking hard for a whale but see none

Saturday

Aug 26th

This day strong breeze from the E S. ship on the wind working to the S. nothing been seen to day dry time.

Sunday

Aug 27th

This day moderate breezes from the E S. ship on the wind working to the S. nothing been seen except fin backs.

Monday

Aug 28th

This day good breezes from the E S. ship on the wind working to the S. men employed in the rigging. Mr. Payer the malt drunk, Capt. has considerable to put up with so ends.
