

Lat-42.7 Thursday Nov 23rd 1882
Long 172.16 This day good breezes from the NE ship on the wind working to the N, saw one seal so ends this day.

Friday Nov 24
This day strong breezes from the NE ship on the wind heading N.W. saw killers right whale feed and one seal.

Lat-39.31 Saturday Nov 25th
Long 174.16 This day strong breeze from the N ship on the wind working to the E. weather thick and rainy saw any amount of fin backs and feed.

Lat-39.6 Sunday Nov 26th
Long 172.13 This day moderate breezes from the SW ship steering NE by N. weather thick part of the day saw a large number of fin backs.

Lat-37.55 Monday Nov 27th
Long 170.29 This day good breezes from the S ship steering first and middle parts to the NE latter part on the wind heading SW by W. saw a great many fin backs so ends.

Lat-37.55 Tuesday Nov 28th
Long 170.26 This day fine weather and very light breezes from the S. at day light - saw ship on the wind heading E by S. saw the Chas. W. Wagon take two right whales could not get down to then wind so light.

Lat-38.01 Wednesday Nov 29th
Long 169.54 This day strong breezes and equally wind from the SSE ship on the wind at day light - raised a right whale lowered three boats but without success. Hand time very hard indeed, both boatsmen raised this whale saw any amount of black fish at night. so ends.

Lat-38.12 Thursday Nov 30th 1882
Long 170.25 This day blowing a heavy gale from the S. ship on opposite tack, about 1 P.M. Mr. Myman raised two right whales going to the windward could not lower for them it was blowing so hard and luck and bad for us who want it as bad as we do. so ends November.

Friday Dec 1st
This day blowing strong from the S weather thick and rainy ship stood on opposite tack during the day.

Lat-37.57 Saturday Dec 2nd
Long 170.37 This day strong breezes from the SE ship on both tacks saw fin backs.

Lat-37.46 Sunday Dec 3rd
Long 170.1 This day moderate breezes from the SE ship stood on opposite tack saw feed fish and birds weather quite thick.

Lat-38.22 Monday Dec 4th
Long 170.25 This day a calm or nearly so ship working slowly to the S saw a number of fin backs so ends.

Lat-38.41 Tuesday Dec 5th
Long 170.6 This day good weather with light breezes from the NE by E ship on the wind heading E by N. about 8 A.M. Mr. Cook raised right whale to the wind lowered all the boats and the Larboard & Starboard boats struck took them along side about 2 P.M. got dinner and commenced to cut got one cut in about 6 o'clock and finished the other about 12 o'clock.
