

Tuesday Jan 16th 1883. Lat 43.36
Long 175.2
Blowing strong from the S.W. ship on both
tacks saw a whale this morning spouted
seven times going to the windward don't
know as it was a sperm whale or not - saw
no more of it. saw the land and one sail

Wednesday Jan 17th
This day light breeze from the S.W. ship
cruising around the land on both tacks
saw the Alaska to the windward.

Thursday Jan 18th
This day strong breeze from the S.W.
ship on both tacks looking land for a
whale but none to be seen saw the Alaska
this morning steering to the N.E. also the
land.

Friday Jan 19th
This day blowing strong from the S.W.
ship under storm sails saw the land this
morning and one sail, called it the
Bk Splendid.

Saturday Jan 20th
This day strong breeze from the S.W. ship
cruising off Pyramid spoke the Bk Splendid
Capt. Cole came on board. saw nothing

Sunday Jan 21st Lat 44.11
Long 175.36 This day moderate breeze from the N. ship
steering N.E. first and middle part latter part
on the wind, saw the land this morning one
sail and black fish so ends another day.

Monday Jan 22nd Lat 44.23
Long 175.37 This day thick fog most of the time wind
from the W. ship on both tacks, saw one
sail so ends.

Tuesday Jan 23rd 1883
This day strong breeze from the S.W.
ship on both tacks nothing been seen
except one sail hard times no whales.

Wednesday Jan 24th
Blowing a moderate gale from the S.W.
ship looking to the N.W. nothing in sight
except one sail and many birds.

Thursday Jan 25th
Blowing a gale from the S.W. about 5 A.M.
George Vincent raised sperm whales to the
land and covered the boats for them. just as the
waist-boat was going to strike a large sea
came and seized her last line and iron
the Larboard & Starboard boats stove some also
the waist-boat. it seems hard to have such
hard luck, the Chat. McKean in sight,
no observation weather cloudy so ends.

Friday Jan 26th Lat 44.1
Long 175.35 This day blowing strong but more
moderate than yesterday this morning
saw sprouts to windward do not know
what it was, wind from the S.W. ship
on both tacks.

Saturday Jan 27th Lat 43.53
Long 174.53 This day good weather with light breeze
from the W. ship on both tacks. one sail
in sight, carpenter employed repairing
waist-boat. took a boat off the house and
put it on the crane took in the waist-boat.

Sunday Jan 28th Lat 44.32
Long 175.37 This day strong breeze from the N.W. ship on
both tacks weather foggy saw one sail called
it the Splendid to the windward.
