


Lat-29.28 Friday Apr 6th 1883
Long 178.53 Good weather wind from the S.E. ship on the wind working to the S.W. about 7 A.M.
Mr Kings raised sperm whales round the boats for them and got one whale to the Starboard boat. The bow and waist-boat struck but did not succeed in getting any took the whale along side and cut it in, and started the try works.

30.26 Saturday Apr 7th
This day good weather with moderate breezes from the N.E. ship on both tacks saw nothing except fish and birds finished boiling to night-whale turned up 29 bls killed a hog

Lat-30.33 Sunday Apr 8th
Long 179.4 Good breeze from the N.E. ship on the wind trying to get to the windward saw a merchant bark steering to the S.E. also saw fish and small pumpkins so ends

Lat 30.26 Monday Apr 9th
Long 179.6 Strong breeze from the E.N.E. ship on the wind working to the S.W. nothing been seen except the birds and fish

Tuesday Apr 10th
Strong breeze from the E.N.E. ship on the wind working to the N. saw French rock this morning bearing to the W. at sunset shortened sail and wore ship. Curtis rocks on our weather quarter to night

Wednesday Apr 11th
Blowing strong from the E.N.E. ship on the wind heading N.W. saw Curtis rocks Goat island and one sail. weather thick

Thursday Apr 12th 1883
This day first part a gale of wind from the N.E. middle and latter part heavy rain and calms and light breezes from the same ship steering away from Curtis rocks S.W. they are a short distance off to the North of us. nothing else been seen weather thick

Friday Apr 13th
This day light breezes from the N.E. ship on both tacks saw Curtis rocks bearing to the N.W. from us.

Saturday Apr 14th
This day very light breezes from the N.W. ship on the wind working to the N. cruising to the Eastward of Curtis rocks and Goat island raised spouts and lowered the boats for them but they proved to be blackfish got none saw one sail called it the Alaska working to the S.W. so ends this day.

Sunday Apr 15th
Moderate breezes from the N.N.E. ship on opposite tacks cruising round the land to night-Goat island bearing to the N.W. and Curtis rocks to the S.W. of us saw one sail on weather bow and small pumpkins

Monday Apr 16th
Squally weather with rain wind from the N.W. ship on the wind working to the N.E. saw Goat island and the Adeline Gibbs she had her main yard aback and close to the mizen peak this morning don't know what she was doing. took down our fore sail to repair. so ends.
