

Lat 34. 4 Thursday May 31st 1883
Long 176. 50 Baffling winds from WSW to N.W. with frequent rain squalls nothing been seen today so ends.

Lat 33. 28 Friday June 1st
Long 176. 6 Strong breeze from the SSW ship on the wind working to the W. nothing been seen, broke out sugar, vinegar, syrup and new oil.

Lat 33. 2 Saturday June 2nd
Long 174. 47 Light breeze from the S. ship stood on point larks. want to get to the S.W. nothing been seen except a steamer and a merchant bark killed a pig. washed ship, so ends.

Lat 33. 46 Sunday June 3rd
Long 174. 40 Very strong breeze from the E.N.E. first and middle part strong S.W. at dark shortened sail and luffed to heading N. weather thick and rainy. do not like to get to near the land.

Lat 33. 40 Monday June 4th
Long 173. 53 First and middle part blowing a gale with very heavy rain from the N.E. ship under storm sails latter part quite clear wind light from S.E. by E. ship on the wind heading S made some sail. saw his sails this morning so ends.

Tuesday June 5th
This day very strong breeze from the N.E. with very heavy rain raised the land this morning kept off for it. and dropped our anchor in Honganui harbor about 5 P.M. in company with the Chas. W. Morgan & Adeline Gibbs. Capt. went ashore after letters. weather continues thick and rainy.

Wednesday June 6th 1883.
This morning Capt. & wife went on shore to see our friends and find out whether we were to stop here or go to Russell. received several telegrams from there saying we must go then returned on board ship about dark.

Thursday June 7th
This morning about daylight hove up our anchor and stood out of the harbor bound for the Bay of Islands. with a head wind to right Cape Brett on our weather bow. beating ship to windward. so ends this day.

Friday June 8th
Strong breeze from the S.W. ship beating up to the Bay with wind dead ahead tonight we are inside of Cape Brett saw several schooners trying to get in so ends.

Saturday June 9th
This day fine dropped our anchor in Russell Bay of Islands about 1 O'clock A.M. Capt. & wife on shore this afternoon.

Thursday July 5th
This morning about 10 A.M. Capt. & wife came on board took our anchor and beat out of the harbor of Russell. wind from N.E.

Friday July 6th
This day blowing a gale from N.W. ship on the wind nothing been seen Capt. & wife sea sick so ends.

Saturday July 7th
Blowing strong but more moderate than yesterday ship steering N.W. saw the Adeline Gibbs steering the same as ourselves. Capt. & wife better so ends.
