

Lat-45.20

Tuesday

Feb 12th 1884

First and middle part blowing strong from the N.W. ship under short sail thick fog first and middle part latter part quite clear saw a sail this morning

Lat-45.28

Wednesday

Feb 13th

This day blowing a heavy gale from the N.W. to W.S.W. ship on the port tack, raining in squalls all through the day nothing been seen fearful bad weather

Lat-45.2

Thursday

Feb 14th

First part of this day blowing strong from the S.W. ship on the wind, middle and latter part steering N.W. by N. moderate breezes made sail, shortened sail at dark saw the land and three sails, so ends.

Lat-44.56

Friday

Feb 15th

This day strong breezes from the N. by N. ship on the wind under short sail employed stowing oil, saw two sails this morning, and the land weather thick and damp, so ends this day.

Lat-45.11

Saturday

Feb 16th

Light breezes from the N. ship on the wind under short sail nothing been seen employed stowing oil weather quite thick

Lat-45.8

Sunday

Feb 17th

This day strong breezes from the S.W. ship stood on opposite tack nothing been seen at sunset shortened sail so ends.

Monday

Feb 18th

Strong breezes from the S.W. ship stood on opposite tack, saw the land to night the pyramid is about six miles off, employed moving some coal put some in the sum

Tuesday

Feb 19th 1884

This day strong breezes from the S.W. ship on the wind on both tacks nearly all day saw the land the pyramid to night about 8 miles off, bearing to the N.W. so ends this day

Wednesday, Feb 20th

First and middle part of this day very strong breezes from the S.W. latter part light breezes, dropped our anchor at Chatham islands about 1 P.M. boat went ashore after letters and returned

Thursday Feb 21st

Light breezes from the S.W. ship still at anchor got off three tons of potatoes seventeen sheep, cabbage, onions &c

Friday

Feb 22nd

First part of this day light breezes from the N. by E. at day light took our anchor and stood out of the harbor of Chatham to the E. at dark wore ship and shortened sail, saw one sail to the leeward weather quite thick killed two sheep so ends.

Saturday

Feb 23rd

Strong breezes from the N.W. accompanied with rain and thick fog nothing been seen killed four sheep so ends.

Sunday

Feb 24th

This day strong breeze from the N.W. ship stood on opposite tack weather rainy and thick fog, no observation and nothing been seen so ends this day.
