

Chronometer correct - now been regulated,

Lat-44.00 Monday Feb 25th 1884
First and middle part of this day
blowing strong from the N.W. latter
part wind changed into the N.E.W.
ship steering N.W. nothing been seen.
Killed six sheep so ends.

Lat-42.53 Tuesday Feb 26th
Long 174.00 Good breeze from the S.E. ship steering N by E.
all sail out - nothing been seen employed
generally so ends this day.

Lat-41.14 Wednesday Feb 27th
Long 174.52 Good breeze from the N. ship on the wind
working to the N.W. employed scraping bone
nothing been seen so ends.

Lat-40.40 Thursday Feb 28th
Light breeze from the N.W. ship on the
wind heading N.W.E. weather thick
and foggy nearly all day nothing seen.

Lat-39.36 Friday Feb 29th
Long 176.18 Good breeze from the S.E. ship steering
N by E. all sail out - nothing been seen
employed this afternoon wetting hold.

Lat-37.11 Saturday Mar 1st
Long 176.26 Strong breeze from the S.E. ship steering
N by E. all sail out - nothing been seen
except one sail a merchantman so ends.

Lat-34.43 Sunday Mar 2nd
Long 176.53 Good breeze from the S.E. ship steering
N.W. by N. nothing been seen today.

Lat-32.59 Monday Mar 3rd
177. 49 Good breeze from the S.W. by S. ship steering
N.W. & N. employed repairing the upper
main top sail at dark shortened sail
nothing been seen so ends.

Lat-31.43 Tuesday Mar 4th 1884
Long 178.29 This day very light breeze from
the S.W. ship steering N.W. by N. latter
part dead calm employed mending
the main spencer and got up some
bone to soak nothing been seen

Lat-31.13 Wednesday Mar 5th
Long 178.12 This day very light breeze from the N
ship on the wind heading N.E. by E. about
3 P.M. John McDade, raised a school of sperm whale
right ahead of the ship five miles off toward
all the boats for them but without success
wind was so light could not get up to them
employed washing bone got through about
3 o'clock, weather fine so ends.

Lat-31.7 Thursday Mar 6th
Long 178.43 Very light breeze from the N. ship on
the wind heading N.W. saw Curtis' peak
to night, on the weather beam. took the
bone up to dry

Friday Mar 7th
This day moderate breeze from the N.E.
ship on the wind heading N.W. saw bunch
to windward also the land tonight - Seal
island on our weather quarter and Curtis
rocks astern ship got up the bone and bunched
six bundles it came on to rain and had
to stop wet hold so ends.

Saturday Mar 8th
Baffling winds changed several times
through the day very heavy rain and
weather thick nothing been seen.
