

Wednesday Mar 19th 1884 Lat 32.10

This day light-breezes from the E N E first and middle part ship on the wind latter part steering N. saw Goat island & Curtis rocks took up the potatoes and picked them over so ends

Lat 30.45

Thursday Mar 20th

Long 179.23 First and middle part of this day good breezes from the N. ship steering S. latter part came in rainy with strong breeze luffed to on the Starboard tack heading W. N. W. saw Goat island and Curtis rocks this morning. cooper employed working on the fore top mast so ends

Friday Mar 21st

This day a calm with heavy rain nearly all day no observation yet hold and pumped ship nothing but seen so ends this day.

Saturday Mar 22nd

This day first and middle part strong breezes from the N. N. E. with rain latter part blowing a gale from the same with very heavy rain took in all sail except the main spencer and fore staysail wore ship on the Starboard tack nothing been seen.

Lat 30.38

Sunday Mar 23rd

Long 179.50 East This day good breezes from the W. S. W. ship stood on opposite tacks weather clear nothing been seen

Lat 31.53

Monday Mar 24th

Long 179.54 East Strong breezes from the W. S. W. ship on the wind working to the S. saw fin back employed making spungum and other things

Tuesday Mar 25th 1884

This day very light-breezes from the N. ship steering N. E. by E. very heavy swell on ship rolled fearfully employed repairing the mainsail and cooper to work on the top mast nothing been seen

Wednesday Mar 26th

This day first and middle part very light breezes from the S. S. E. ship steering N. N. E. latter part more wind with rain squalls had the bone up to dry some of it got wet and had it to wash over French rock in sight bearing to the N. N. E. about 12 miles off. shortened sail at sunset and come to on the Starboard tack heading E employed repairing the main sail

Thursday Mar 27th

Good breezes from the S. E. ship steering E. N. E. weather fine. took up the bone to dry and finished the mainsail and Ant-il-saw French rock and Curtis rocks tonight bearing to the N. of us 25 miles off shortened sail at sundown and luffed to, caught nineteen fish.

Friday Mar 28th

Strong breezes from the S. E. ship steering N. N. by W. saw Curtis rocks this morning Goat island and Sunday island tonight also saw a brack do not know what it was never saw it afterwards employed wetting hold and cooper finished the topmast so ends this day.
