

Saturday Mar 29 1884

This day strong breezes from the E. first and middle part steering S W by S latter part W from Goat island this morning saw Sunday island Goat side and Curtis rocks in sight but caught some small fish and nothing else seen except a few birds no whales

Sunday Mar 30th

Strong breezes from the E S E ship on the wind heading S. saw a school of killers and Goat island on the weather beam about 25 miles. wish we could get a whale soon

Lat-30.16

Monday Mar 31st

Long 179.37 This day strong breezes from the E by N ship steering N S W, saw one sail called it the Adeline Gibbs also saw a large piece of squid caught a few small fish.

Tuesday Apr 1st

This day strong breezes from the E S E with thick and rainy weather nearly all day ship steering N S W, nothing seen

Lat-31.31

Wednesday Apr 2nd

Long 178.59 Strong breezes from the E S E ship on the wind working to the S nothing been seen except fish cooper employed making over coaks.

Lat-32.30

Thursday Apr 3rd

Long 178.30 Strong breezes from the E. weather cloudy ship stood on the port tack first and middle part latter part wore ship shortened sail at dusk saw a school of porpoises so ends broke out slop coak and supplied the crew, also broke out beef & pork

Friday Apr 4th 1884

This day good breezes from the N E ship on the wind on both tacks spoke Bark Swallow Capt. Mc Innis came on board and spent the day he is one year out 700 bbls all told

Saturday Apr 5th

Good breezes from the N E by N ship on the wind heading E by S nothing been seen except the Swallow so ends.

Sunday Apr 6th

Very light breezes from the N ship on the wind working to the N E under all sail shortened sail at dusk nothing been seen

Monday Apr 7th

This day light air and calm ship does not go ahead very much employed bundling bone saw one sail called it the Swallow so ends weather fine

Tuesday Apr 8th

Good breezes from the N E. first and middle part ship on the wind heading N N W, latter part steering S W by W. employed bundling bone finished it 9117 lbs this season nothing been seen.

Wednesday Apr 9th

Very light breezes from the N W ship steering S W by W. weather fine employed on the rigging mizzen. saw the Swallow this morning also saw a school of porpoises

Thursday Apr 10th

Very strong breeze from the S S E ship steering S W with what sail we can carry weather squally nothing been seen
