

Lat-34. 23

Friday

Apr 11th 1884

Long 175. 18. First part strong breeze from the S & ship steering S by E middle and latter part light breeze ship steering the same saw the land to right - three points on the lee bow just at dark

Saturday

Apr 12th

This day strong breeze from the S by N. ship beating up to Cape Brett. which is to the windward of us about fifteen miles off, winds rather baffling all day

Sunday

Apr 13th

This day light breeze from the S & ship beating into the harbor of Russell came to an anchor about 12 o'clock found the Trilon in here Capt. Childs came on board. weather fine. so ends.

Wednesday

May 7th 1884

This day fine weather with no wind Capt. Brighton & wife came on board about 4 P.M.

Thursday

May 8th

This day fine weather with good breeze from the S.W. took our anchor at daylight and stood out of the harbor of Russell left the Swallow Capt. McInnis at anchor ship steering N.E. strong breeze to night

Lat-33. 27

Friday

May 9th

Long 177. 37 Very strong breeze from the S ship steering N.E. by E very high sea on. weather squally at dark shortened sail saw one sail

Lat-32. 47

Saturday

May 10th 1884

Very strong breeze from the S & ship on the wind heading E.N.E. a very heavy swell on weather cloudy nothing been seen except a sun fish so ends.

Sunday

May 11th

This day strong breeze from the S & ship steering N. nothing been seen except several pieces of squid heavy swell on.

Monday

May 12th

Strong breeze from the S & by S. ship on the wind heading E by N. very heavy swell on nothing been seen so ends.

Tuesday

May 13th

This day strong breeze from the S & E. first part ship on the wind heading N.E. middle and latter part steering N by E saw Burt's rocks and Goat island to night close to on our weather beam nothing else been seen

Wednesday

May 14th

Strong breeze from the S & E. ship steering N by N from Goat island saw a fin back and the land so ends this day.

Thursday

May 15th

Very light breeze from the S & E ship on the wind heading S all sail out nothing been seen today so ends.

Friday

Lat-31. 14

Long 179. 44

Strong breeze from the N.S.W. first and middle part wind from the North ship steering S.W. latter part on the wind heading S by E. saw a large number of porpoises and a school of killer whet hold. shortened sail at sunset.
