NE by E. nothing except birds been seen.

Lat 38.17 Monday Feb 2nd
Long 179.7 First and middle part of this day strong
breeze from the W. latter part very light-
breeze from the same ships under all sail
steering N by W. nothing been seen

Lat 36.53 Tuesday Feb 3rd
Long 178.12 Good breezes from the N.W. ship on
the wind working to the N. weather
good nothing been seen. so ends.

Lat 35.32 Wednesday Feb 4th
Long 176.46 Strong breezes from the N.W. ships on the
wind. want to get to the N.W. nothing
been seen and nothing to write

Lat 34.44 Thursday Feb 5th
Long 176.56 Very light breezes from the S.W. ships.
steering N.W. by W. weather good. saw a
piece of squid and a school of small jumpers
killed the last sheep to night. so ends.

Lat 33.22 Friday Feb 6th
Long 178.24 Blowing strong from the S.E. ship
steering N.W. by W. weather clear nothing
new to write nothing been seen except
squid would like to get a whale.

Lat 32.33 Saturday Feb 7th
Long 179.25 Good breezes from the E. ship steering N by S
under what sail that will draw
employed making spun yarn. nothing
been seen. so ends this day.

Lat 32.00 Sunday Feb 8th 1885
Long 179.59 Good breezes from the S.E. ship steering
N by W. weather fine nothing been
seen. dry times very indeed.

Lat 30.57 Monday Feb 9th
Long 179.21 Good breezes from the S.E. ship steering N
by W. saw grasshoppers. men employed
making spun yarn. broke out flour.
Manuel de Medeiros, one of the four mast-
hands been sick two weeks today with a
very hard cough. Samonie off duty sick.

Lat 30.08 Tuesday Feb 10th
Long 179.40 Light breezes from the E.S.E. ship stood
on opposite tacks. nothing been seen
men employed making spun yarn
and various other jobs.

Lat 30.51 Wednesday Feb 11th
Long 179.35 Moderate breezes from the E by S ship on
the wind working to the S. nothing
been seen. employed rearing new
main gallant-backstay lanyards, and
also to work in the rigging so ends.

Lat 31.16 Thursday Feb 12th
Long 179.85 Light breezes from the E.S.E. ship on
the wind working to the N.W. nothing
been seen men employed in the
rigging and picked over the potatoes.

Lat 30.48 Friday Feb 13th
Long 179.57 Good breezes from the S.E. by E. ship on
the wind working to the N.E. weather
fine. men employed repairing the
lower main top sail saw jumpers and
flying fish so ends this day.
