This day strong breezes with rain from the E by N. ship on the wind about dark wind changed into the NNE ship steering E by S. weather thick, and wind died away to a calm.

Wednesday May 13th
This day a dead calm and thick fog, weather very disagreeable indeed. saw several sulphur bottom round the ship.

Thursday May 14th
This day a dead calm and thick fog with some rain making no headway towards America.

Friday May 15th
This day strong breezes from the N. ship steering E by S. weather thick and rainy. no observation.

Saturday May 16th
This day strong breezes from the N. ship steering E. weather thick and rainy, very disagreeable every thing so wet and damp had a fire in the cabin for two days. nothing new to write.

Sunday May 17th
This day strong breeze from the N. ship steering E by N. weather thick and rainy, no observation ship under what sail we can carry.

Monday May 18th
This day first and middle part strong breezes from the N. latter part wind from the NW ship steering E by N. weather thick and rainy.

Long 140.51.

This day first and middle part blowing strong from the S. latter part wind from the SW. weather very squally hail and rain squalls. ship steering E by N. under what sail we can carry.

Lat 47.03

Long 136.38.

First and middle part of this day strong breezes from the SW. latter part wind N. ship steering E & N. broke out a bag of flour, meat, water, bread, and molasses.

Lat 47.18

Long 132.14.

Strong breezes from the SW. ship steering E. weather cold, and cloudy most of the day. sun came out bright this morning. nothing new to write.

Lat 47.34

Long 127.59.

This day blowing very strong from the NW ship steering E & N. took in all sail this afternoon except lower main top sail and reefed fore sail. blowing very hard tonight and the barometer 1/2 inch above 29.

Lat 48.07

Long 123.51

This day blowing hard from the W. ship steering E by N. weather squally had some hail squalls through the day barometer down to 28.90.

Lat 48.14

Long 119.57

This day weather good wind from the SW. ship steering E by N. had several hail squalls through the day. wind moderate most all day.

Tuesday

May 19th 1845

This day first and middle part blowing strong from the S. latter part wind from the SW. weather very squally hail and rain squalls. ship steering E by N. under what sail we can carry.

Wednesday

May 20th

First and middle part of this day strong breezes from the SW. latter part wind N. ship steering E & N. broke out a bag of flour, meat, water, bread, and molasses.

Thursday

May 21st

Strong breezes from the SW. ship steering E. weather cold, and cloudy most of the day. sun came out bright this morning. nothing new to write.

Friday

May 22nd

This day blowing very strong from the NW ship steering E & N. took in all sail this afternoon except lower main top sail and reefed fore sail. blowing very hard tonight and the barometer 1/2 inch above 29.

Saturday

May 23rd

This day blowing hard from the W. ship steering E by N. weather squally had some hail squalls through the day barometer down to 28.90.

Sunday

May 24th

This day weather good wind from the SW. ship steering E by N. had several hail squalls through the day. wind moderate most all day.
