Wednesday June 24<sup>th</sup>

This day good breezes from the S.W. ship steering NE by N. with all sail out weather quite cloudy. men employed repairing the mizzen gellont sail the cook filled up his line tub with new line nothing in sight and nothing special to write. cooper took down the cabin store and put it back into the house on deck.

Thursday

June 25<sup>th</sup>

Long 32. 44

This day good breezes from the W to the N.W. ship steering NE by N. men employed making new footropes for the main yard and various other jobs. weather very comfortable.

Lat-27. 45

Friday

June 26<sup>th</sup>

Long 31. 09

This day strong breezes from the W.N.W. to the N.W. ship steering NE by N. weather squally saw one sail steering into the NE. men employed taring the footropes and other jobs. broke out water vinegar wet hold &c.

Lat-24. 59

Saturday

June 27<sup>th</sup>

Long 30. 15

This day moderate breezes from the N.W. to N.W. by N. weather good ship steering NE by N. some times she would head her course and at other times would not men employed repairing the main sail finished it and bent it again.

Lat-22. 57

Sunday

June 28<sup>th</sup> 1885

Long 29. 32

This day first and middle parts moderate breezes from the N.W. latter part very light breeze from N.W. ship steering N.W. weather squally. saw a school of fin backs or hump backs to windward.

Lat-22. 2

Monday

June 29<sup>th</sup>

Long 29. 15

This day calms and light breezes from all quarters, squally and raining at times all through the day. employed making spun yarn, and various other jobs one sail in sight. we steering N by E when we could get the wind, so ends.

Lat-21. 7

Tuesday

June 30<sup>th</sup>

Long 28. 37

This day good breezes from the N.W. ship on the wind heading NE men employed making spun yarn cooper made a new gong way board saw the land called Martin Pass. bearing N by W. a long distance off. weather rather squally and cloudy.

Lat-19. 32

Wednesday

July 1<sup>st</sup>

Long 27. 38

First part of this day moderate breezes from the N.W. ship on the wind heading NE. about 1 P.M. the wind changed in a heavy rain squall into the N. ship steering N.E. squally all the afternoon one sail in sight steering the same way as ourselves. men employed in the rigging and making spun yarn.
