

Lat-17. 50 Thursday July 2nd 1885
Long 27. 53 This day moderate breezes from the N to S.W. ship steering N. weather fine men employed fixing the rigging and making spungarn, bent a new main gallant stay sail, broke out a cask of bread, beef & pork and water saw one sail, on our lee quarter.

Lat-15. 57 Friday July 3rd
Long 28. 30 This day good S.E. trades, ship steering N.E. with all sail out; men employed in the rigging and making spungarn also other jobs about the ship, nothing in sight - so ends this day, saw fin backs.

Lat-12. 57 Saturday July 4th
Long 29. 23 This day strong S.E. trades, ship steering N by E. with all sail out; men employed in the rigging, two sails in sight also fin backs. weather squally throughout the day, broke out sugar so ends.

Lat-10. 13 Sunday July 5th
Long 29. 43 This day strong breezes from the E to S.E. ship steering N by E & E. with all sail out weather squally this morning, breeze steady this afternoon. three sails in sight steering to the N. so ends this day.

Lat 7. 02 Monday July 6th
Long 29. 53 Strong breezes from the S.E. weather good ship steering N by E. men employed in the rigging and doing other work about the ship saw thirteen sails and one steamer going different ways.

Lat-4. 30 Tuesday July 7th 1885
Long 30. 39 First and middle part of this day strong breezes from the E. ship steering N latter part moderate breezes from the same ship steering N by W. with all sail out men employed in the rigging saw four sails one steering the same way as ourselves, weather very squally this morning, steady breeze to night - so ends.

Wednesday July 8th
Lat-2. 32 Long 32. 2 This day moderate breezes from the E ship steering N by W. weather fine, men employed setting up the fore rigging and taking down, saw two sails and a large steamer. broke out a keg of butter and some dried apples.

Thursday July 9th
Lat-0. 21 S Long 32. 37 This day moderate breezes from the S.E. ship steering N by W. weather fine men employed setting up the main rigging and taking down broke out water, saw one sail.

Friday July 10th
Lat-1. 10 N Long 33. 56 Light breezes from the S. ship steering N.N.W. men employed taking and to work in the rigging wet hold, nothing been seen, and nothing special to write.

Saturday July 11th
Lat-2. 35 Long 34. 56 First part of this day very light from the W. middle and latter parts moderate breezes from the S by W. ship steering N.N.W. had heavy rain all night and this morning, men employed washing ship, broke out water saw nothing.
