Long 35.31

Sunday

July 12th 1855

This day light breezes from the S.E. ship steering N. under all sail that will draw saw one sail working to the S. weather hot but fine, so ends this day.

Lat-4. 50

Long 35.33

Monday

July 13th

Very light breezes from the S.E. ship steering N with all sail out men employed setting up the mizzen rigging, taring down, scraping and painting the iron work, saw one sail working to the S. weather fine and hot.

Tuesday

July 14th

First and middle part of this day very light breezes from the N. with rain latter part light breeze from the S.E. and clear, ship steering N. men employed washing ship out side and took up one of the cables to clean, nothing in sight.

Lat-6.38

Wednesday

July 15th

First part of this day light breezes from the S.W. ship steering N by W. middle and latter part wind variable with rain, men employed cleaning the cable, and scraping iron work saw several dolphins.

Lat-7. 00

Long 35.57

Thursday

July 16th

This day calms and light breezes from the S.W. with rain. ship steering N by W. to N.W. men employed cleaning the cable, saw a school of black fish.

Lat-8-40

Long 36.30

Friday

July 17th 1855

This day moderate breezes from the N.W. to W. weather squally and rainy at times, ship steering N.W. men employed cleaning the cable, saw a school of porpoises, wet hold and so ends this day.

Saturday

July 18th

First and middle part of this day calms and light breezes from the S.E. with rain, latter part clear wind very light ship steering N.W. men finished the starboard cable and put it below, no observation

Long 37.44

Sunday

July 19th

This day a calm, and weather very hot nothing in sight and nothing to write about.

Monday

July 20th

First part of this day moderate breeze from the N. with very heavy rain accompanied with thunder and lightning, middle part wind changed into the N.W. ship on the wind heading N.W. and wind light, a large steamer passed us in the night, nothing been seen to day men employed cleaning the port cable.

Lat-11.15

Long 39.29

Tuesday

July 21st

First part of this day strong breeze from the N.E. with rain and weather squally, middle and latter part the same, ship steering N.W. by N. wet hold and found two hoops off the oil between decks took them on deck and fixed them and stowed them back again, still cleaning the cable.
