

Lat-32.4 Tuesday Aug 11<sup>th</sup> 1885  
Long 66.9 Very light-breeze from the S. ship steering  
N W by N. weather fine and hot. men  
employed doing various odd jobs about  
the ship four sails in sight. and a  
school of grampuses

Lat-32.40 Wednesday Aug 12<sup>th</sup>  
Long 66.42 Very light-breeze from the S S E ship  
steering N W by N & N. weather fine and  
hot. men employed painting the boats  
and putting on a new mast-coat at  
the main. two sails in sight and  
some dolphin around the ship.

Lat-33.11 Thursday Aug 13<sup>th</sup>  
Long 67.18 First part of this day a dead calm  
middle and latter parts light-breeze  
from the N S W. ship steering N W by N & N  
weather fine and hot. employed generally  
nothing in sight except one sail

Lat-35.8 Friday Aug 14<sup>th</sup>  
Long 68.49 This day strong breeze from the N S W  
weather very squally. ship steering  
N by N & N. employed doing odd jobs  
about the ship. nothing in sight  
came into the Gulf Stream today.

Lat-37.1 Saturday Aug 15<sup>th</sup>  
Long 69.52 First and middle part of this strong  
breeze from the N S W. weather very squally  
ship steering N by N & N. latter part wind  
changed into the N ship on the wind  
heading N N W. very strong breeze and  
still squally. employed taking down the  
tryworks and &c. saw plenty of Gulf mud.

Lat-37.3 Sunday Aug 16<sup>th</sup> 1885  
Long 71.00 This day moderate breeze from  
the N. ship stood on opposite tacks  
got a head wind for New Bedford  
nothing in sight so ends this day

Lat-38.15 Monday Aug 17<sup>th</sup>  
Long 70.45 First and middle part of this day  
moderate breeze from the E N E ship  
on the wind working to the N. latter  
part wind very light-ship on the wind  
employed painting some and varnish-  
ing the skylight &c saw one sail

Lat-39.7 Tuesday Aug 18<sup>th</sup>  
Long 70.40 First part of this day very light-breeze  
from the W. middle parts good breeze  
latter part wind N by N. ship steering  
N & N. weather fine. saw a school of  
porpoises and a large steamer. also  
three sails.

Wednesday Aug 19<sup>th</sup>  
Early this morning made Block  
Island. a pilot came off to us but  
we did not take him. took New  
Bedford pilot about 3 P.M.  
The owners sent a tug boat down to  
us and we came to an anchor  
about dark in the harbor of New  
Bedford after an absence of 52  
months. took during the time  
3850 bbls of oil and 25.000 lbs bone.

Saw Sperm whales 42 Times  
Saw Right whales 76 Times  
Got 76 Whales in all.
