Lat-34.4 Monday Aug 2nd
Long 50.26 Strong breeze from the S.W. and rain
squalls ship on the wind heading
S.S.E. making spun yarn saw one sail

Tuesday Aug 3rd
Strong breeze from the W. ship on
the wind on different tacks.

Lat-32.47 Wednesday Aug 4th
Long 49.58 Light-breezes from the W. ships
on the wind on different tacks.
employed making mats for rigging

Lat-32.10 Thursday Aug 5th
Long 49.30 Light-breeze from the W.S.W.
with rain squalls ship on the
wind to the S. nothing been seen

Lat-31.20 Friday Aug 6th
Long 48.57 Light-breezes from the N. ship steering
S. Mr Kingo raised sperm whales at 11
O'clock lowered the boats and the Starboard
boat struck Mr Kingo. Took the whale
to the ship. Starboard boat had one
missed.
