

Lat 31.34 Saturday Aug 7th 1886.
Long 48.48 Light-breezes from the N and pleasant
cut-in the whale and commenced
to boil middle and latter parts same

Sunday Aug 8th
Lat 31.55 Strong breeze from the NNE ship
Long 49.26 on the wind on different-lacks
finished boiling at 12 O'clock and
headed up 24 barrels.

Lat 32.4 Monday Aug 9th
Long 48.34 Light-breeze from the NNE
ship on the wind to the NW.

Lat 32.10 Tuesday Aug 10th
Long 49.26 Strong breeze from the NNE and
weather pleasant. ship on the wind
heading NW, employed in ships
duty look in sail at sunset.

Lat 32.30 Wednesday Aug 11th
Long 50.11 Light-breezes from the NE ship
on the wind on different-lacking
looking hard for whales.

Lat 32.20 Thursday Aug 12th
Light-air and calms from E ship
on the Starboard tack employed generally

Lat 32.20 Friday Aug 13th
Long 50.37 This day first part a calm
employed setting up rigging
middle and latter parts
the same nothing been seen

Lat 32.23 Saturday Aug 14th 1886.
Long 50.17 Light-air from the SE ship
steering NE. employed setting
up rigging. nothing been seen

Lat 33.4 Sunday Aug 15th
Long 50.00 Light-breezes from the SE ship
steering NE. saw a large sperm
whales case. Look in sail at
dark and luffed too on the
wind starboard tack so ends

Lat 33.48 Monday Aug 16th
Long 49.34 Light-air from the SE made
sail at day light. and steered
NE by E. saw a school of black fish
and three sails

Lat 34.9 Tuesday Aug 17th
Long 49.1 This day light-breezes from the
SSE ship steering E nothing new
to write so ends this day.

Lat 34.23 Wednesday Aug 18th
Long 47.44 Light-breezes from the S ship
steering E by S. employed setting
up main top mast rigging.

Lat 34.24 Thursday Aug 19th
Long 47.34 This day a calm ship laying
still employed repairing the
fore sail nothing been seen

Lat 34.39 Friday Aug 20th
Long 46.37 This day light-breezes from
the SE ship on the wind
cut off the top of the main
sail as it was too long.
