Lat-35.23 Saturday Aug 21st 1886. Lat-33.48

Long 47.7 This day a strong breeze from the ESE. raised sperm whales at day light - covered for them and the Starboard boat struck, and took the whale to the ship Mr. Green raised these whales.

Lat-35.7 Sunday Aug 22nd

This day strong breeze and rain squalls. commenced to cut at day light - finished at 7 O'clock.

Lat-35.00 Monday Aug 23rd

Long 45.47 Strong breeze and rain squalls ship on the wind heading SSE. employed boiling.

Tuesday Aug 24th
Weather fine wind from the S W. ship on the Starboard tack still boiling so ends.

Wednesday Aug 25th
Light-breezes from the S W. ship steering SE. finished boiling headed up 97 barrels.

Lat-34.34. Thursday Aug 26th
Long 45.48. Light-breezes from the W N W ship steering E by N. coopered the oil so ends.

Lat-34.40 Friday Aug 27th
Long 44.25 Strong breezes from the West with rain squalls ship steering SE. saw several sails.

Saturday Aug 28th 1886.

Strong breezes from the W S W. ship on the wind. stowed down 105 bbl of oil in the blubber room. and at 2 P.M. kept off steering E. at 3 P.M. raised sperm whales and covered for them and the Starboard boat struck took the whale along side at dark got supper and set the watch so ends this day.

Sunday Aug 29th

This day blowing strong from the N W. at day light commenced to cut got through about dark. let the head lay over the side all night - had a hard time cutting it was so rugged.

Monday Aug 30th

This day light breezes from the N W. took in the whales head after breakfast putting up the blubber on deck and also boiling.

Tuesday Aug 31st

This day moderate breezes from the E N E ship on the wind employed boiling weather to night - rainy in squalls. saw grampas and plenty of fish.

Wednesday Sep 1st

Lat-33.39 Long 43.34 This day strong breezes from the E. ship on the Starboard tack. very high sea on finished boiling whale turned up 78 bbl. Took out Sugar beans rice dried apples and beef and pork.
