Saturday

Oct 2nd

Strong breezes from the N.E. ship steering S.E. W. saw two sails going about the same way as ourselves.

Long 24.59

Sunday

Oct 3rd

Moderate breezes from the E.N.E. ship steering S.S.E. this morning, saw Brava some distance off to windward of us also saw two steamers.

Lat-13.00

Long 24.4

Monday

Oct 4th

Good breezes from the N.W. ship steering S.S.E. weather fine. nothing been seen.

Tuesday, Oct 5th

This day squally weather with heavy rain wind baffling most of the time wind from E.N.E. nothing been seen no observation, so ends.

Long 22.20

Wednesday Oct 6th

Moderate breezes from the S.E. ship on the wind heading S.S.W. weather squally with rain first and middle parts latter part pleasant.

Lat-9.13

Long 22.24

Thursday

Oct 7th 1886.

This day light airs from the S.E. ships on the wind, saw a school of black fish, men employed in the piggery broke out flour.

Lat-8.40

Friday

Oct 8th

This day fine weather with light airs from the N.E. ship steering S weather very hot, broke out 102 lbs of sugar, saw one sail going in the opposite direction.

Lat-7.30

Long 22.10

Saturday

Oct 9th

This day first part very light breeze from the E. ship steering S by W middle and latter parts wind baffling with thunder and very heavy rain squalls broke out molasses saw one sail

Lat-7.15

Long 22.5

Sunday

Oct 10th

First and middle part of this day very light breeze from the E.S.E. ship steering S by W, latter part rain squalls, about 9 A.M. Mr. Grasse raised sperm whales going, W.N.W. lured all the boats and got five whales two to the Starboard one to the Larboard Waist & Bow boats, got them all along side in the evening got supper and set the watch saw a large number of whales.
