Friday

May 27<sup>th</sup> 1887

Strong breeze from the S by W ship stood on opposite tacks weather squally ship under what sail we can carry trying to get to the S.W. men employed in the rigging

Saturday

May 28<sup>th</sup>

Long 178.48 Strong breeze from the S.W. and weather very squally, ship on the Southern tack. men employed in ships duty, saw fin backs.

Lat-33.11

Sunday

May 29<sup>th</sup>

Long 178.10 Strong breeze from the S.W. weather squally ship stood on opposite tacks saw a merchant ship going the same way as ourselves.

Lat-33.12

Monday

May 30<sup>th</sup>

Long 180.00 Light breezes from the S by E. ship on the wind working to the S.W. men employed mending sails broke out bread and water. nothing seen.

Tuesday

May 31<sup>st</sup>

Long 179.48 This day a calm, light breeze sprung up about dark from the N. ship steering S.W. by W. made all sail, men employed generally, nothing in sight - so ends.

Wednesday

June 1<sup>st</sup>

Long 179.8 Light breezes from the S.S.E. ship steering S.W. by W. under all sail, men employed washing ship, also broke out beans, rice, peas, sugar, molasses, lard and pork, vinegar and coffee. nothing in sight.

Lat-34.40

Thursday

June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1887

Long 175.37 Strong breeze from the E. ship steering S.W. by W. shortened sail some at dark. employed painting some and finished washing ship. weather squally.

Friday

June 3<sup>rd</sup>

Strong breezes from the E. ship steering S.W. by W. made the land Cape Bull at day light right ahead. dropped our anchor in the harbor of Russell about 11 A.M. weather fine.

Friday

July 1<sup>st</sup>

Weather fine took our anchor and stood out of the harbor about 11 A.M. wind from the S.W. light with all sail out. so ends.

Saturday

July 2<sup>nd</sup>

Strong breeze from the S.E. ship steering N.E. under what sail we can carry. nothing in sight - so ends.

Lat-32.00

Sunday

July 3<sup>rd</sup>

Long 179.6 Very strong breeze from the S.E. ship steering by the wind. under what sail we can carry. nothing special to write so ends.

Lat-30.48

Monday

July 4<sup>th</sup>

Long 178.48 This day strong breeze from the S.E. ship on the wind working to the N.E. saw Curtis rocks about noon. passed to the windward of them. very nasty sea on. broke out two bags of flour.
