

Lat-29.35 Tuesday July 5th 1887.
Long 176.39 Moderate breeze from the S.E.
ship steering N. weather fine, saw
two fin backs. Broke out slop coat.

Lat-28.7 Wednesday July 6th
Long 176.12 This day light breeze from the
S.E. ship steering N. under all sail
nothing in sight. employed in the
rigging.

Lat- Long Thursday July 7th
This day moderate breeze from the
E. ship on the wind working to the
N. nothing in sight. employed in
the rigging weather cloudy no
observation.

Lat-26.41 Friday July 8th
Long 177.22 First and middle parts of this day
light breeze from the N.W. ship on
the wind heading N.W. latter part
wind from N.E. one ship heading
E. S.E. employed in the rigging saw
one sail and a number of fin backs.

Lat-26.43 Saturday July 9th
Long 176.25 Moderate breeze from the N.W.
ship steering N.E. at dark shortened
sail and heaved to heading N.
men employed in the rigging
saw one sail this morning.

Lat-26.20 Sunday July 10th
Long 175.49 Strong breeze from the N.W. ship
stood on opposite tack, under
easy sail. nothing in sight.

Lat-26.10 Monday July 11th 1887.
Long 176.10 This day light breeze from the
S.E. ship on the wind working to
the E. men employed setting up
rigging at the main saw one sail.

Lat-25.37 Tuesday July 12th
This day strong breeze from the S.W.
and weather squally. first part ship
steering N. middle and latter parts
on the wind heading N.W. men
employed in the rigging saw two
sails and fin backs. so ends.

Lat-24.55 Wednesday July 13th
Long 176.42 This day moderate breeze from
the S. weather squally first and
middle part on the Starboard tack
heading W. wore ship at 4 o'clock
P.M. saw one sail called it the Kilauea.

Lat-23.59 Thursday July 14th
This day light breeze from the
S.W. ship on the wind working
to the W. men employed mending
the spanker. nothing in sight.

Lat-25.00 Friday July 15th
Long 177.14 This day calms and light
airs from the S.E. ship steering
S.W. employed mending sails
weather fine and clear nothing in
sight - dry times.

Lat-25.16 Saturday July 16th
This day blowing a moderate
gale from the N. first and middle
parts steering W by S. latter part hove to
broke out coffee sugar dried apples and
two bags of flour. saw a white whale.
