

Lat 31.42

Thursday Sep 15th 1887 Lat 33.57

This day blowing a heavy gale from the E. ship bore too under storm sails weather thick and rainy.

Lat 32.17

Friday Sep 16th

Still blowing a very heavy gale from the S.E. with rain weather thick still Lat 34.39
bore too under storm sails, very heavy sea on ship rolls fearfully.

Saturday Sep 17th

Still blowing a very heavy gale from the S.E. with rain, weather thick and very disagreeable ship heading S.W. no observation.

Sunday Sep 18th

This day blowing very strong but more moderate than yesterday very high sea on, thick and rainy no observation.

Lat 31.33

Monday Sep 19th

Strong breeze from the S.E. by S. ship on the starboard tack heading E by N. made what sail we can carry, very heavy swell.

Lat 31.36

Tuesday Sep 20th

Strong breeze from the S by W. very heavy swell ship on the starboard tack heading S.E. by E. ship under what sail we can carry, broke out coffee molasses four bags of flour, and opened stop cask and supplied the new men

Lat 32.31

Wednesday Sep 21st

This day squally weather wind baffling most of the time from the S.W. ship on the wind heading S.E. employed painting the boats, nothing been seen opened a new chest of tea.

Thursday Sep 22nd 1887

Good breezes from the S.W. first part steering E. saw the Three Kings and passed them kept off for the North Cape steering E. weather good finished painting the boats, and employed generally.

Friday Sep 23rd

First and middle parts of this day strong breeze from the N.W. ship steering S by E. latter part blowing strong, ship luffed too on the Port tack under storm sails, carried away the jib, rainy and thick all day saw one sail.

Saturday Sep 24th

Strong breeze from the N.W. ship beating up to Cape Brett. To night it bears W.S.W. from us about eight miles off, one point on the weather bow, saw one sail come out of the harbor, killed four terns so ends.

Sunday Sep 25th

Strong breeze from the W.S.W. weather squally, ship beating up to Cape Brett got drifted off last night had a very heavy squall last night with thunder and lightning.

Monday Sep 26th

First part of this day moderate breeze from the N.W. ship beating up the Bay. Capt. Loued a boat with Mr. Buss and boat's crew and started for Russell middle and latter parts blowing strong weather thick and rainy, the boat did not come off or we did not see it.
