

Saturday Feb 4<sup>th</sup> 1888.

Light breeze from the S.E. at day light commenced to cut: got through, and sailed the case about 6 P.M. looked for ambergris about two hours found a little. weather fine Goat and Sunday islands in sight: killed a sheep.

Sunday Feb 5<sup>th</sup>

Strong breeze from the S.E. first and middle parts on the port tack heading S.W. rose ship at five P.M. heading N.E. by E. Goat and Sunday islands in sight employed boiling saw only quantity of birds.

Monday Feb 6<sup>th</sup>

Strong breeze from the S.E. ship on the starboard tack heading S.W. weather squally saw Sunday island this morning employed boiling. plenty of birds in sight - so ends.

Tuesday Feb 7<sup>th</sup>

Good breeze from the S.E. ship cruising weather cloudy. Sunday island in sight bearing to the N.E. some distance off. finished boiling this morning whale turned up 116 lbs.

Wednesday Feb 8<sup>th</sup>

Light breeze from the S.W. ship on the wind heading S.E. by S. employed stirring down in the main hatch blocked it off. Goat island in sight bearing S.E. saw paper.

Thursday Feb 9<sup>th</sup>

Very light breeze from the S.W. ship steering S. weather fine finished stirring down the oil. at sunset shortened sail and luffed to heading S.E.

Friday Feb 10<sup>th</sup> 1888.

Strong breeze from the S.E. ship cruising saw Goat and Curtis islands this morning bearing to the S.W. from us. weather smoky. broke out two large bags of flour. saw large jumpers.

Saturday Feb 11<sup>th</sup>

Moderate breeze from the S by E. ship on the wind heading S.W. by W. saw jumpers and Goat island to night on the weather beam. killed a sheep.

Sunday Feb 12<sup>th</sup>

Strong breeze from the S.E. ship stood on opposite tacks nothing in sight except Goat island bearing to night S.W. from us ten miles off. so ends.

Monday Feb 13<sup>th</sup>

Strong breeze from the S.E. by S. ship stood on both tacks Sunday and Goat islands in sight - also saw jumpers heavy swell on. took up the bone to wash tomorrow.

Tuesday Feb 14<sup>th</sup>

Good breeze from the S.E. ship on the port tack heading S. employed washing bone. Goat and Curtis islands in sight bearing to the Eastward of us ten miles off.

Wednesday Feb 15<sup>th</sup>

Light breeze from the E. ship on the wind working to the N and E. Curtis rocks and Goat island in sight. took up the bone to dry.

Thursday Feb 16<sup>th</sup>

Moderate breeze from the S.E. ship cruising bundled the bone turned out 2729 lbs. Sunday and Goat island in sight.
