Gale raised a school of sperm whale right ahead of the ship. got up to them about 1 O'clock and lowered the boats and got one whale to the Bow boat got it alongside and made secure about 9 O'clock. Larboard boat dented but without success. there was a large number of them.

Long 176.39 Light-breeze from the W by S. at day light commenced to cut got through about 10 A.M. cleared away the head and wore ship heading S by W. nothing been seen so ends.

Tuesday Nov 13th
Long 176.29 Strong breeze from the W by N. ship on the wind working to the SW. weather squally. finished boiling whale turned up 39 bls. nothing seen.

Lat-30.53

Wednesday Nov 14th
Long 176.57 Strong breeze from the SW. ship on the wind heading WNW. saw one spout. broke out water so ends.

Lat-30.21

Thursday Nov 15th
Long 177.6 Light-breeze from the SW by W ship on the wind working to the S. saw a large white water do not know what it was employed stowing oil got down all that was cold enough.

Friday Nov 16th
Long 177.14 Light-breeze from the WSW. ship broke out on the wind working to the S. saw four large grassy weather fine and pleasant. flock.

Lat-30.49

Saturday Nov 17th
Long 177.41 Blowing strong from the N by W with heavy rain in squalls. nothing been seen so ends.

Lat-31.6

Sunday Nov 18th
Long 177.30 Strong breeze from the NNW. weather thick and muggy ship on the starboard tack working to the W.

Lat-31.12

Monday Nov 19th
Light-breezes from the NW to N ship stood on both tacks. rain very heavy in squalls and weather thick no observation.

Lat-31.12

Tuesday Nov 20th
Long 178.6 Light-breeze from the SE. ship steering NNE. weather quite thick and rainy at times. saw a school of black fish. broke out molasses.

Lat-31.12

Wednesday Nov 21st
First part of this day light-breeze from the SE. middle and latter parts strong breeze from the same ship steering NNE. at dark took in sail and luffed too heading ENE. saw a merchant Barkentine steering NNE. also saw a large white water.
