Saturday, Sept. 10<sup>th</sup> 1881 Lat 24 Long 20  
The first part of the day quite moderate weather - the latter part breeze increasing from the south to a fresh gale - there has not any thing bin in sight - spoke the Remover

Sunday Sept 11<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day blowing a fresh breeze from the S. west the latter part a little more moderate - Remover & the land is all that has bin in sight -

Lat. 25.48. " "

Monday, Sept 12<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day a strong breeze with rain squalls - the latter part the same the captain went ashore this fore noon - we broke out the oil & cooped it - to night heading of shore -

Prayal

Tuesday, Sept 13<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day quite moderate breeze the lighter came after the oil about eight o'clock - & brought potatoes, onions & bafe - to night heading of shore -

Discharged the oil & bafe

Sent our ke of tobacco ashore & got four more more -

Wednesday Sept 14<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part a strong breeze N. N. W. & rain squalls sent the boat ashore & 2 men left. - the latter part also strong breeze - sent the S. B. after the captain came of about four o'clock with another extra man & left her of south -

Thursday, Sept. 15<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day strong breeze from the N. - the latter part more moderate - nothing bin seen through the day steering S. & South ~~west~~ all sail out -

Lat. 26.20. " "

Friday Sept. 16<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day fine weather with a good breeze from the N. N. west steering S. E. & S - the latter part the same - nothing bin seen through the day -

Saturday Sept. 17<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day fine weather with moderate breeze from the N. broke out flour heads & hoops & shovels - the latter part fine steering S. E with all sail out set up 4 casks & one steamer is all that has pass bin seen

Sunday, Sept. 18<sup>th</sup> 1881 Lat. 27 & 28

the first part of the day moderate breeze from the Eastward - the latter part the same steering to the S. E - nothing bin in sight through the day -

Monday, Sept 19<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day calm - one sail & gramblers - the latter part a breeze sprung up from the S. & sent the mail to speak the brig - but got to her - setting up casks & flagging them -

West

Tuesday, Sept 20<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day moderate breeze 2 sails in sight the latter part the wind increased a little clear & good seeing 4 sails in sight steering - South - took out sails out of the lower hole & put them between decks

Wednesday, Sept 21<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day quite clear 3 sails land in sight? broke out steam S. S. W. land raised about 11.30 am - broke out sails from the lower hole & put them between decks - the latter part squally - & foggy - land bearing S. W. by S. -

Land in sight? broke out sails

Thursday, Sept 22<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day quite fine weather land on our lee beam lacked & stood of from Tenerife 12.30 am the latter part a good breeze & smoky - to night heading south east - land a head -

Teneriffe

Friday, Sept. 23<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day light & clear sailing winds beating up to the town - the latter part wind hauled to N. came to anchor in Tenerife harbor at 2.30 pm John & Winthrop Remover & three other whaling schooners

Saturday, Sept 24<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day more moderate breeze the latter part a little more - one brig 6:30 N. hill & schooner Pedro. Villar - came in & anchored - latter came of

Sunday, Sept 25<sup>th</sup> 1881

the first part of the day fine & clear - got water & potatoes the latter part clear & calm - all well -
