

Monday, Sept. 20th 1851
the first part of the day fine weather with a moderate breeze - coals came aboard & shipped & men - & got potatoes the latter part calm - the Albatross came to anchor -

Tuesday, Sept. 21st 1851
the first part of the day moderate breeze captain came aboard & we got under way - leaving the tender, 9.7 AM with 24. shells. Albatross, schooner Union, Amelia & E. Cornwall - the latter part the same - steering all sail out.

Wednesday, Sept. 22nd 1851
the first part of the day fine weather steering S.W. & S. wind N.E. the latter part the same weather steering S.W. & W. & N. wind N.E. - nothing in sight.

Thursday, Sept. 23rd 1851
the first part of the day a strong breeze & fine weather backing out between decks - & built a potato fire - steering S.W. & N. the latter fine weather steering S.W. by N. & N. nothing in sight.

Friday, Sept. 24th 1851
the first part of the day strong breeze from the S.W. & S. steering S.W. & N. - opened the slops & gave seven men the slops & suits a piece - the latter part a good breeze from the E. N. East steering the same way we saw whales before.

Saturday, Oct. 1st 1851
the first part of the day strong breeze steering S.W. & N. the latter part steering S.W. & N. nothing in sight.

Sunday, Oct. 2nd 1851
the first part of the day strong breeze from the E. steering S.W. the latter part gradually wind backed in to the S.W. - by the wind under all sail - on Jan back -

Monday, Oct. 3rd 1851
the first part of the day unfavorable winds - heavy rain squalls - the latter part light winds & squalls backing around - heading to night by the wind on the port tack S.W.

Wind S.W. East -
May we get a fair of oil before long.

Tuesday, Oct. 4th 1851
the first part of the day a little squally the latter part quite fine weather with moderate winds from the Southward porpoises - conch fish & a piece of squid.

Wednesday, Oct. 5th 1851
the first part of the day squally & a strong breeze - & backing from the S.E. - the latter part shoaled breeze from the E. S. E. nothing in sight through the day.

Thursday, Oct. 6th 1851
the first part of the day calm - the latter part calm - nothing in sight - all well.

Friday, Oct. 7th 1851
the first part of the day wind E. & N. E. light steering S.W. & N. on Jan back in sight - the latter part calm - lowered the boat for blackfish, dished several times but never got any.

Saturday, Oct. 8th 1851
the first part of the day heavy rain - squalls from the S.E. light winds - the latter part the breeze increased steering by the wind, S. West -

Sunday, Oct. 9th 1851
the first part of the day 24 hours calm the latter part a little breeze from the east steering S.W. - may we see whales & get some.

Monday, Oct. 10th 1851
the first part of the day a little breeze from the N.E. - porpoises the latter part calm heading S.W. & N. - may we get a fair of oil before long.

Tuesday, Oct. 11th 1851
the first part of the day quite a good breeze from the E. & a strong squall of wind & rain - 3 schools of blackfish - the latter part raised a whale & 2.30 P.M. lowered 3 boats for him S.W. & Star - when we got to him it was a Jimcock.
