the first part of the day a strong breeze from the S.E.
with rain - the latter part moderate with fine weather
and sun - wind S.E. grampuses is all that has been seen -

Wednesday, Nov 1st 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part a strong breeze from the S.E.
with rain the latter the same, one merchantman bound N.
seen in the port one parted.

Thursday, Nov 2nd 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part a fresh breeze - S.E. the latter
part light & fine weather S.W. - not a thing in sight.

Friday, Nov 3rd 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day fine weather with
wind S.E. steaming S. set up the gun - the latter part
N. E. East & fine light - porpoises is all that has been seen

Saturday, Nov 4th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day fine weather with
wind S.E. steaming S.W. the latter part
grampuses, porpoises is all that has been in sight -

Sunday, Nov 5th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day moderate breezes
from the S.E. steaming S.W. washed ship in side latter
part wind N. very moderate -

Monday, Nov 6th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day squally moderate
breeze E.N.E. 2 merchantmen & 2 finbacks. the latter part
very moderate breeze - steaming S.W.

Tuesday, Nov 7th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day moderate & fine
weather, steaming S.W. wind E.S.E. the latter part
the same wind hauled to the N.E. light -

the first part of the day squally light
breezes from the E. steaming S.W. the latter part
one merchantman bound N. wind N. East -

Thursday, Nov 9th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day squally with
a fresh breeze from the E. the latter part weather increa-
sed to quite a rain storm - steaming S.W.

Friday, Nov 10th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day fine weather, wind
N.E. fresh, the latter part fresh breeze one merchantman
bound to the S. East - may we get a whale before long

Saturday, Nov 11th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day thick & smoky
wind N.E. the latter part wind hauled in to the N.W.

Sunday, Nov 12th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day rain & fog wind
N.E. steaming S.W. one finback the latter part wind hauled
round to the S to right heading N. S. West strong breeze

Monday, Nov 13th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day a strong breeze
wind S.W. the latter part more moderate wind with S -

Tuesday, Nov 14th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part moderate & fine wind N. S. W. -
plenty of finbacks. the latter part the same -

Wednesday, Nov 15th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day fine weather
plenty finbacks - the latter part a little breeze from East

Thursday, Nov 16th 1851 Lat 34 Long 22
the first part of the day a strong breeze
from East, steaming S.W. by S. the latter part breeze up to
a fresh gale & came in fog & rain at four o'clock P.M.
down to on the fore tack supposed to be on the Right
whale ground, & right under lower main to haul heading
S. S. E.
