sight, steaming S.E. the latter S.E. heading to under lower topsails

Friday Dec. 2nd 1881
N.W. & S.E. the first part of the day squally steaming to
the N.E. the latter part squally steaming S.E. plenty of
finbacks & feed - may we get a whale before long -

Saturday Dec 3rd 1881
the first part of the day fair & steady
heading in to the S.E. the latter part fine weather with
much sea from the S. to night under lower topsails
fin & spruce - heading S.W. by N.
