



Monday. Dec. 17th 1881

the first part fine & moderate. the latter part
blow up. lowered for a while at 12 o'clock S. B. & boat
S. B. got him & then the 4th boat got another
cut the first one. finished boiling the others

Tuesday. Dec. 20th 1881

the first part of the day fine, cut our other whale
in. the latter part stilled down 22 lbs of oil nothing in
sight through the day.

Wednesday. Dec. 21st 1881

the first part of the day fine. finbacks in sight
at 2 P.M. raised 2 right whales & lowered & got one S. B. boiling
as fast as we can, may god bless us with a good season

Thursday. Dec. 22nd 1881

the first part blowing a gale from the N.W. cut the
whale. while eating saw 6 others. the latter part saw another

Friday. Dec. 23rd 1881

the first part a strong breeze & smoky the latter
part foggy. stilled down. boiling the last whale we got

Saturday. Dec. 24th 1881

the first part blowing strong with fog, the latter
part moderating w. gib & spunk - heading to the N.W. west
Boiling

Sunday. Dec. 25th 1881

the first part of the day fine & moderate
raised whales at 7 A.M. lowered 3 boats the mate struck &
lowered & then the 3rd mate struck & got one. S.B. lowered at
one P.M. & got another. may we have good weather

Monday. Dec. 26th 1881

the first part of the day foggy with a strong breeze
the latter part moderate & clear stilled down & boiled & cut
one whale - may we have good weather to morrow

Tuesday. Dec. 27th 1881

the first part of the day quite a fine breeze from
the N.W. cut our whale & about 11.30 A.M. raised 2 sperm
whales - going to the windward. lowered mate & 2nd mate
but never got near them. began to boil -

Wednesday. Dec. 28th 1881

the first part still a water stilled down the
latter part fine with a moderate breeze. finished boiling the
other pair - sailing finished the other pair - 1 right whale

Thursday. Dec. 29th 1881

the first part of the day a fresh breeze & whales
raised by John & Ann - lowered & at 12 o'clock struck one the
L. boat got the whale -

Friday. Dec. 30th 1881

the first part of the day fine stilled coal & water
began to cut. the latter part 3 whales raised by the cook & lowered
L. boat & S. boat the mate struck & was broke - & then the
struck another & saved him

Saturday. Dec. 31st 1881

the first part of the day fine & calm weather. went
out in the L. boat cut our whale & finished stilling oil in
the fore hold may we have a good season

Sunday. Jan. 1st 1882

3 P.M. & M.M. the first part of the day fine with a moderate
breeze. at 2 A.M. raised 3 whales lowered for the nearest at 1.30
raised 2 more going. & went but never got near them

Monday. Jan. 2nd 1882

the first part fine moderate. broke out rigging
& emptied the casks. the latter part foggy. broke out for trucks
but did not find them. one merchantman

Tuesday. Jan. 3rd 1882

the first part smoky broke out the lumber rack
& shacks & set them up stilled them for water - the latter
part foggy. rainy wind N. W. S. nothing sight

Wednesday. Jan. 4th 1882

the first part foggy blowing a fresh gale broke
out water & stilled down. the latter part moderate -

Thursday. Jan. 5th 1882

the first part blowing quite fresh the latter P
increased to a fresh gale - finbacks & birds in sight
