The first part of the day calm bunched 2943 pounds of bone the latter part got the remainder of the same & put it to soak - 38.43. 55.03

Monday. Feb. 6<sup>th</sup> 1852

The first part a little breeze from the N. & the latter part calm. to night a light breeze from the N.W. steaming S.E. & W

Tuesday. Feb. 7<sup>th</sup> 1852

The first part a light breeze from the N.W. finished bunched bone & weighed it all to gather 6053 pounds. & stored it between decks. got the boat of the
