stirred down forty barrels of oil. the latter part weather
increasing. Rain & fog washed ship in side.

Tuesday May 23rd 1882
the fore part of the day fresh breeze from the E. clear
in sail in sight supposed to be a whaler course to by 10
4 o'clock hailed her the wind heading S.E.

Wednesday May 24th 1882
the fore part of the day strong breeze & squally
land made 8 P.M. the foot high. then light of Cape B
came in to the day. & anchored at 6 P.M. & got letters

Thursday May 25th 1882
the fore part rain & squally weather washed ship out
side. move anchor & the two boats us around the mission
the latter part Rain. watch ashore to night

Friday May 26th 1882
the fore part of the day broke out shocks & set
set up, the latter part the same. & mixed Rain

Saturday May 27th 1882
the fore part fine again to paint & set up shocks
the latter part the same. W. a. S. breeze

Sunday May 28th 1882
the fore part of the day. Rain. watch
ashore. the latter part the same.

Monday May 29th 1882
the fore part of the day fair weather. setting up
shocks. paint & in boat in filling water

Tuesday May 30th 1882
fine & clear setting up casks filling water painting & coal taking the trends

court set & the said men were tried & sentenced to be hanged
the next court. - Rain. Rain Rain Rain

Saturday June 3rd 1882
the fore part of the day fine with a light
breeze from the N.W. the latter part also fine and
the same. Our long waited for vessel has arrived from
Auckland. S. B. Stalkinett to take oil

Sunday June 4th 1882
the fore part of the day Rain & fog arrived
S.E. Light. towed the merchantmen to the dock by 8 whale
boats 3 Alaska & California & R. Morrison & A. Gibbs boats

Monday June 5th 1882
the fore part of the day Rain wind
S.E. the latter part. Rain W. N. E. breeze

Sailed

Tuesday June 6th 1882
the fore part of the day Rain. N. E.
the latter part fine. took our Anchor at 4 P.M.
made sail for Sea Mar. God bless us & a safe
