

Passage South Right Whaleing
11 miles S. E. S. W. Friday Sept 14th 1882
May be successful. the fore part of
the day blowing fresh from the S. the latter part
the same with a heavy swell running.

Saturday Sept 16th 1882
the fore part of the day a strong breeze with
rain squalls. Course S. by E. to the latter part a strong breeze
with rain squalls hanging around. Cut the 2nd mast sail

Sunday Sept 17th 1882
the fore part of the day squally with a moderate
breeze from the E. the latter part at 12.45 P.M. sighted Lord-
Island & 2nd of them. passed within 40 miles to the
E of them finbacks one sunfish is the only thing seen

Monday Sept 18th 1882
the fore part of the day fine weather
with a moderate breeze from the N. Cooked the brace
& broke out shocks. the latter part shifted wood & broke
new main braces & second handeled fore. finbacks & fish

Tuesday Sept 19th 1882
the fore part of the day fine & moderate weather
with drizzling winds. shifted ends with the topsail
braces fore main. the latter part fine blackfish & finbacks
& porpoises. Course S by E & S. W. - setting up shocks

Wednesday Sept 20th 1882
the fore part of the day fresh breeze from the
West. finbacks & porpoises - the latter part fine with
a strong breeze from the same quarter. Cold water down
taken by George

Thursday Sept 21th 1882
the fore part of the day blowing fresh with
a heavy swell running. Wind S by E. the latter part
the same heading S. by E. under short sail. setting up Sh

Friday Sept 22th 1882
the fore part of the day blowing a fresh
gale from the W. with a heavy swell running. the latter
part better weather. Wind hauling to the south heading W

On The Right Whale Ground
Saturday Sept 23th 1882
Another day has passed & gone & the sun
gone down in the far West. If we poor mortal beings have
to sail on. the fore part blowing a fresh gale from the W. W.
the latter part weather better with a heavy swell running
Lat 36.34 Long 155.46

Sunday Sept 24th 1882
the fore part of the day blowing a fresh gale
from the N. N. W. running to the S. W. the latter part
moderating to a calm. Nothing in sight. - all well
Lat 36.57 Long 156.10

Monday Sept 25th 1882
the fore part of the day a strong breeze
from the S. W. increasing to a strong gale blowing to
under main topsail. the latter part only main braces
weather moderating a little. finbacks inhabit these parts
Lat 37.34 Long 155.27

Tuesday Sept 26th 1882
the fore part of the day blowing a fresh gale
from the S. W. the latter part the same nothing in sight
Lat 36.33 Long 156.14

Wednesday Sept 27th 1882
the fore part of the day fine weather wind
N. W. the latter part calm & a light breeze course S by
porpoises & finbacks is the only thing to be seen
Lat 36.54 Long 153.09

Thursday Sept 28th 1882
the fore part of the day strong breeze
squally from the N. W. here to under main topsail
the latter part the same nothing in sight. Wind S.
Lat 37.52 Long 152.17

Friday Sept 29th 1882
the fore part of the day a light breeze from
the N. increasing. Course S. the latter part a strong breeze
to right laying to under main braces heading E.
Lat 37.37 Long 152.40

Saturday Sept 30th 1882
Rain the fore part of the day blowing fresh
Laying under S. by E. & S. W. part the time N. E.
the latter part wind hauling to the S. W. blowing fresh
to right heading N. W. under S. by E. & N. E.
Lat 38.38 Long 152.53
