Thursday Nov 30th 1882 Long Is.

So ends another month without a whale. May the next month be more fruitful the fore part of the day blowing a fresh gale from the S. S. E. heading E. the latter part weather increasing. 2 Whales Raised by H. B. H. at 1 P. M. wind S. E. waves lowest Rugged - - -

Friday Dec 1st 1882

the fore part of the day blowing strong from the S. S. E. heading to the E. under lower sails. the latter part the same S. wind shift & headed to the S. W. under S. M. F. -
Lat " " Long " "

Saturday Dec 2nd 1882

the fore part of the day strong breezes from the S. S. E. & foggy. the latter part the same. heading to the eastward on Star Tack not any thing moving - a few birds
Lat 38.00 Long 170.30

Sunday Dec 3rd 1882

the fore part of the day fresh breezes from the E. S. E. fog & smoke. the latter part lighter breezes from the same quarters. on different tacks to night under short sail heading to the Northw
Lat 38.22 Long 170.25

Monday Dec 4th 1882

the fore part of the day smoke with raw light airs from different quarters. the sun the mainsail down & put her head cinkles in the latter part slick calm a few finbacks -

Tuesday Dec 5th 1882

the fore part of the day fine a Right whale raised by Mr Cook. downed four boats the Starboard Boat got 1st & B. another. the latter part more whales in sight but them small

Wednesday Dec 6th 1882

the fore part fine. cleared away the heads & started the works. latter fine with light airs from the N. W. a few finbacks in sight
Lat 38.48 Long 168.47

Thursday Dec 7th 1882

the fore part light airs N. N. E. plenty of finbacks. C. W. M. Raised at 10.30 A. M. the latter part part on our lee beam @ 6 P. M. Raised her whaling with all her boats down. boiling
Lat 38.42 Long 170.07

Friday Dec 8th 1882

the fore part fine breeze from the S. C. W. M. cutting her whale to the leeward of us. latter part joined S. S. E. heading E - M. on the lee Quarter
39.00 170.18

Saturday Dec 9th 1882

the fore part. wind increasing C. W. M. in sight on the weather bow. Whales Raised by the Cook at 2.30 downed 4 boats the S. B. & the whale C. W. M. last sun steering N. cut the whale
Lat 38.51 Long 169.58

Sunday Dec 10th 1882

the latter part a fresh breeze from S. W. plenty of finbacks in sight - C. W. M. latter part no finbacks & a little fog
Lat 38.44 Long 170.44

Monday Dec 11th 1882

the fore part of the day smoky wind S. S. W. broke out Cooper & stored down some of the oil. a few finbacks C. W. M. in sight last sun of her going N. W. M. on Star tack - - -
Lat 38.43 Long 170.10

Tuesday Dec 12th 1882

the fore part light winds run a little oil. the latter part fine breezes from the S. S. W. plenty of finbacks & a school of black fish
Lat 38.36 Long 170.04

Wednesday Dec 13th 1882

the fore part fine broke out casks Cooper them & finished storing 184.25. latter part several finbacks in sight
Lat Long
