the fore part strong breeze & increasing on different tacks & running latter part a moderate gale squally on P. Tack. nothing in sight

Sunday March 4th 1883

the fore part blowing strong wind N. E. & S. E. on port & star tacks. Curtis Rocks on our weather beam. Not a living thing to be seen

Lat 30.41 Long

Monday March 5th 1883

the fore part blowing strong with Rain squalls wind E & S. E. on port tack goat I & Curtis - Rocks in sight latter part the same

Tuesday March 6th 1883

the fore part of the day quite good weather a fine breeze past Curtis Rocks & goat I. on Star tack heading N. N. W. under short sail

Wednesday March 7th 1883

the fore part of the day moderate breeze on port tack goat Island & Curtis Rocks on our weather Not a living thing moving -

Thursday March 8th 1883

the fore part squally wind S. on port tack Curtis Rocks on our weather quarter French Rock raised at 9.30 a.m. 1 point on the lee bow. latter part past it. Cask of flour opened 5 1/2 bbls.

Friday March 9th 1883

the fore part of the day a strong breeze Course N. wind N. E. sent down lower main topsail & hunched it here goat Rocks latter part bit it. Not a thing in sight on P. T. & N. W.

the fore part of the day a strong breeze generally past to windward goat I & Curtis Rocks & kept off west past to N of goat I. the latter part raised a sail. at 4.45 P. M. a large whale raised by J. B. H. Thymen covered 4 boats 4th mate went to the whale & darted in his head & did not get fast. More whales to the windward, on S. T.

Friday March 16th 1883

the fore part of the day blowing strong from the E. N. E. on different tacks goat I. on our weather latter part Run of a whale S. by E & came between the Rocks & goat island. plenty of birds may we meet with

Saturday March 17th 1883

Another day has Roared over our head & the sun gone down in the far west. the fore part a strong breeze from the N. E. & N. W. by E. goat I & Curtis Rocks under our lee. latter part a school of blackfish

Sunday March 18th 1883

the fore part of the day thick & Rainy with a strong increasing wind N. E. Whales raised at 8.30 A. M. the Comm. Whales going S. to leeward four boats mate got out small whale. latter part cut them blowing a gale Whales 10. miles N. E. goat Island - going S. W.
