works ready for boiling - on S. E. in P. & S. P.

Wednesday, March 21st 1883
the fore part of the day blowing a fresh one
S. W. run O. at 12.4 P.M. came to on port tack
Goat I. under our lee. Quarter latter part moderate
ing a little 1.30 P.M. Raised (H. Morgan) past
Close to the windward of us. Nothing in S. or E.

Thursday, March 22nd 1883
the fore part of the day a strong breeze
from the N. on P. tack began boiling. our whale
the latter part squally. C. W. M. past to the leeward
not a thing moving Goat Island & points on our west

Friday, March 23rd 1883
the fore part squally with light breezes
from the N. W. & N. the latter part gamed
C. W. M. all well. Goat Island in sight -

Saturday, March 24th 1883
the fore part a very light breeze from C. W. M.
on our weather bow & Goat I. another whale on our
weather beam. latter part the same. Goat I. sailing
N. S. W. Sunday S. W. N. W. all well.

Sunday, March 25th 1883
the fore part Calm Goat I. & Sunday
Island in sight C. W. M. & 12 other whales
known in sight. the latter part a very light
air from the S. W. & S. E. Nothing in S.

Cruising Around Goat I. & C. Rick's
Monday, March 26th 1883

the fore part a strong breeze & squally. 2
whales in sight. Sperm whales raised at 6.15. AM.
Supposed to be the same ones that was seen last night
at 1/2 past 12. going N. by N. toward four boats from
them at 10. AM. L. B. 1. & 2 boat another. the
latter part cut them great & in sight all well

Tuesday, March 27th 1883
the fore part a storm from the S. E. started
the works but raining cooled down. the latter part
rain. at 8. P.M. started the works & clearing away
the heads. on port tack heading S. E. -

the fore part blowing a S. E. gale with
heavy rain. cooled down again. the latter part rain
& blowing. at 10. P.M. wind N. E. blowing a gale.

Thursday, March 29th 1883
the fore part of the day blowing a N. E.
gale started the works & 12 o'clock cooled down
again. the latter part lying under main spencer
may we have some good weather. -

Friday, March 30th 1883
the fore part Calm & thick with a
heavy sea running. started the works. the latter
part light breeze from the N. W. & W. Course N
nothing in sight moving - all well. so end.

Saturday, March 31st 1883
the fore part light breeze from the west
unch Rock in sight bearing S. E. 35. M. the latter
part very light breeze. teamed with A. Gibbs

Sunday, March
So ends this month. May the coming
one be fruitful. All well -
30.57.
