Sunday April 15th 1883

the fore part of the day a good breeze from the N. on different tracks that I & Curtis took in sight to the N. of us. the latter part a whale on our weather bow. not a thing in seen

Monday April 16th 1883
the fore part of the day a strong breeze from the N. N. W. sent down the foresail to Munch. Rain. A. Gibbs in sight. the latter part equally & baffling breeze. Goat S. tarry to.

Tuesday April 17th 1883
the fore part of the day. blowing a strong breeze from the N. N. W. & N. W. Munching the foresail. C. N. M. & A. Gibbs in sight. the latter part land seen. Laying about N. 33. miles distant. All well. so good

Wednesday April 18th 1883
the fore part of the day a fresh breeze from the S. on different tracks goat S. & C. N. M. in sight to the windward. Munching the foresail. Purely Island in our lee quarter not a thing moving

Thursday April 19th 1883
the fore part fine light breeze from the S. S. E. on Port tack finished the foresail & sent down the M. S. M. S. John's gaffersail. latter part fine goat S. & Curtis Rocks in S

Friday April 20th 1883
the fore part quite fine weather C. wind a school of sperm whales raised by Co. Curvo going S. W. toward 4 boats. the N. B. got 1 - the latter part cut it goat S. & Curtis Rocks bearing about E. on our weather 30. miles off

Saturday April 21st 1883
the fore part. blowing fine from the S. E. & Rainy. the latter part the same munched the clubs & put it in the tank on Star tack.

Sunday April 22nd 1883

the fore part of the day blowing strong from the E on starboard tack. Goat S on our weather beam. the latter part moderating a little wind N. E. by E. on Port tack not a thing in the shape of whales.

Monday April 23rd 1883
the fore part. at fresh breeze from the N. E. Munching the S. & Main. T. Garversail bent & started the works. the latter part A. Gibbs in sight & another whale on our weather beam. finished hilling our great whale. on Port tack heading E by S

Tuesday April 24th 1883
the fore part of the day. blowing a strong gale from the N. E. with rain. A whale in sight supposed to be the Robert Morison. the latter part Bent. M. J. moved hilling into the S. N. stood in for the land to S. (Gibbs) might come to on Port tack Goat S on our lee beam (N. star)

28.26
Wednesday April 25th 1883
the fore part of the day fine weather wind S. S. W. stowed down our whale & began to bundle the Bundled bone. the latter part finished then was 2826 lbs. a whale in sight Sunday S. Goat S. & Curtis Rocks to night came to on Star tack. Cornish is all that has been seen

Get up for Ripping
Thursday April 26th 1883
the fore part. fine breeze from the S. S. E. & S. E. on Port tack heading to the S. S. W. Set up for Ripping & made new tops. Sunday. S. & Goat Island in sight. the latter part fine S. S. bearing S. E. by E 13 miles a whale on our weather bow. 3rd mate sick

Friday April 27th 1883
Left Goat Island the fore part fine breeze from the S. E. & Rainy. the fore part S. & Curtis Rocks we take our departure a steamer & a whaler in sight - set up for Ripping & made coping for Ripping. the latter part weather increasing. to night under Short Sail heading to the Westward
