the fore part of the day blowing from the N. W. & N. E. W. Course S. S. W. Sunday S. bearing N. W. 40. miles. the latter part weather increasing & at 5 on our weather from Course S. by N. under short sail & Curtis Rocks on our N. W. For. topsail Lifts In. P. T. T. T. Lifts & Crotchie P. Ropes &

Sunday May 13th 1883

The fore part of the day blowing a strong gale from the N. bearing under main spinnaker & Rain. latter part Rain & which falling to the N. W.

Monday May 14th 1883

The fore part of the day blowing a strong S. W. gale. broke out from S. heading to the S. E. the latter part on port tack laying under M. Spencer. porpoises in sun - all well.

Tuesday May 15th 1883

the fore part blowing a gale from the S. S. E. under M. P. the latter part the same & very squally. on N. tack N. S. W.

Wednesday May 16th 1883

the fore part of the day blowing a strong gale from the S. S. E. on port tack made French Rock at day light bearing S. 10 miles past the Red clot boat bars N. W. 12. miles from the Rock; latter part blowing under short sail. Not a diving thing moving

Thursday May 17th 1883

The fore part of the day blowing a fresh gale from the S. S. E. on port tack the latter part squally. Nothing in seen

Friday May 18th 1883

A strong breeze from the S. S. E. on port tack the latter part on star tack. squally weather moderating. Not a thing to be seen moving - Mizzon topsail foot Ropes down & Crotchie Lifts

the fore part of the day with a good whaling breeze in back on star tack heading S. E. the latter part the same. Mizzon topsail foot Ropes put up & of 9 galentail

Sunday May 20th 1883

Another year has past away we are yet spared. Now on coming year be a fruitful one the fore part fine light breezes from the S. S. E. on star tack. one sail astern. the latter part the same

Monday May 21st 1883

the fore part fine light breezes from the S. S. E. on star tack. Killers sent down Mizzon topsail & M. P. Lifts & foot Ropes a whale in sight. latter part fine on port T. wind S. E. fore T. T. Lifts down -

Tuesday May 22nd 1883

The fore part of the day fine with the wind O. Course S. overhauling the Mizzon Rigging & set up the topmast rigging. the latter part fair some merchantmen. Nothing in the shape of a whale.

Wednesday May 23rd 1883

the fore part of the day a strong breeze from the N. E. sailing to the S. at 10.30 M. P. off. N. by S. Killers & jibacks. overhauled main & Mizzon topsail halliards to night steaming

Thursday May 24th 1883

the fore part blowing a strong breeze from the N. & squalls of rain on star tack. the latter part weather moderating a little not a thing moving

Friday May 25th 1883

the fore part quite fair weather in on star tack making Shungam & tacking the Mizen Rigging the weather sick from the track down. the latter part Calm. on
