increasing to a moderate gale & squalls of rain
Laying under m. topsail. one man sick

Sunday Aug. 12th 1853
24.40 the fore part blowing a strong gale from the
E. Laying on port tack & latter part on star.
Not a thing to be seen.

Monday Aug. 13th 1853
24.20 the fore part of the day blowing strong &
176.144 very much on star tack against S. E. Wind E. S. E
Latter part on port tack wind the same. Nothing seen

Tuesday Aug. 14th 1853
24.32 the fore part - all the day fair weather wind
176.33 E. S. E. on star tack. Not a thing to be seen
Nothing. Laying under m. topsail. - all for the best

Wednesday Aug. 15th 1853
23.48 the fore part calm & clear. Towed the L.
176.21 boat up & hauled her inside & out. & the Mast Boat
in sight. Latter part a little breeze from the N. course
N. E. by E. - Not a thing to be seen

Thursday Aug. 16th 1853
23.27 the fore part calm. Wind S. W. Course E. N. E
177.24 hauled the Mast Boat & the boat inside. Latter part
wind S. course E. by N. tack the sailing out of L. B

Friday Aug. 17th 1853
23.28 the fore part of the day fine weather
178.46 wind S. course E. by N. hauled L. B. inside
hauled the Mast Boat. Latter part fine wind S. S. E
course E. N. E. a few fish & fish around.

Saturday Aug. 18th 1853
23.14 the fore part fine. Wind E. S. E. on star
178.43 tack on port. Woke out one fish & got out
Latter part a school of blackfish. & a few fish

Saturday Aug. 19th 1853

23.04 the fore part of the day a strong breeze from the
178.436 E. S. E. on star tack. Latter part the same. Not a thing

Sunday Aug. 20th 1853
22.13 the fore part of the day. Clouds & thick
178.23 wind E. S. E. course N. E. & N. W. E. Latter part
weather increasing & squalls & light S. W. S. W.
Land wind all 5.30 P. to being N. S. W. S. miles
came to the wind on port tack. Nothing to be seen

Monday Aug. 21st 1853
20.56 the fore part of the day. Blowing strong
178.21 from the E. S. E. on star tack all of the islands had been
in sight to day to the westward. the latter part a school of
blackfish - & the are the ones group.

Tuesday Aug. 22nd 1853
One. 8 the fore part of the day quite fair weather. Run
down to the One Islands & hauled off & sent the L. B
to the Red but no landings. Latter four o'clock took out
butter & sugar & the 2 cotton yachts & left them in dock

Wednesday Aug. 23rd 1853
Recruiting? the fore part of the day fair weather Laying
off & on at One Island getting recruits. got off
three boat loads of Yams Cucumbers & Bananas & 5 chickens
1 fig - wind N. E. standing off. - " - "

Thursday Aug. 24th 1853
the fore part of the day weather fine N. & N. W.
boats sent in after recruits Yams Cucumbers & potatoes
figs, bananas. & figs & paper chickens. Latter part
very moderate & smoky - N. W. N. W. - Left the land

Friday Aug. 25th 1853
the fore part of the day quite a good
breeze from the S. on port tack. Woke out meat
stripped the coconut leaves & stowed the same
away. Latter part Clouds wind S. by E
