On The Right Whale Ground

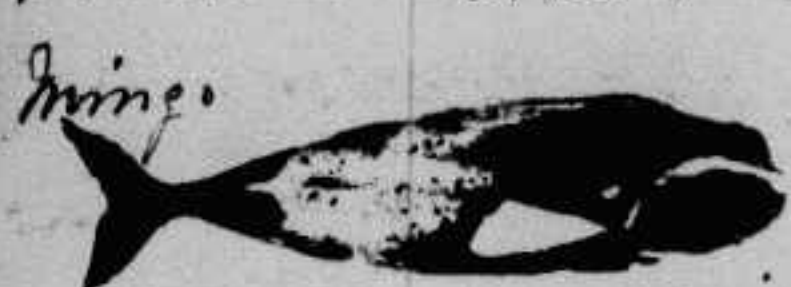
Wednesday Dec 12th 1843

Cook Lowered 3 boats L. W. + S. W. got the whale
after taking starboard boat down. all saved —
rather part cut the whale —

Thursday Dec 13th 1843

the fore part a strong breeze from the
N. W. Whales Raised by L. W. + S. W. did not get him through mistake
or bad management must have been Europa take
on. Latter part weather increasing boiling

the fore part fine light breeze from
the N. Whales Raised by L. W. + S. W. got the whale Latter part
cut the whale + started the works —
more whales in sight — 2 men sick —

boiling + storming down. Latter part the same
Whales Raised by the cook at 5.40 A.M.

the fore part fine broke out + pump
water in main hatch + stored down —

Lowered 2 boats L. W. + S. W. whale gained quick
S. by S. — R. Europa in sight —

the fore part a good breeze from the N.
+ smoke at 11.15 A.M. a whale Raised by J. G.
going S. by S. River lowered + latter part Rain

the fore part a squally with a moderate
breeze on different decks. Nothing in sight Latter
part the same —

the fore part fine light westerly breeze
on fore tack storming down sail in N. W. S. Latter part
finished stowing + blacked of main hatch + were ship
Nothing moving — several men sick — stored down
8625 lbs all shot

the fore part filled the ground + filled with salt
water. broke out better + stored 3 casks of water down
the blubber room. Latter part clearing up around
Course through the day S. by S. — 1. fth —

Saturday Dec 15th 1843

the fore part of the day — squally wind S. by S.
Course S. by S. Nothing moving a Calcutt sun. Latter
part S. by S. + S. by E. several men unwell —

Sunday Dec 16th 1843

the fore part a strong breeze S. by S. W. Course
S. by S. Latter part smoke down S. by S. not a
thing moving —

Monday Dec 17th 1843

the fore part moderate breeze from the N. W. W.
+ S. W. + S. W. River two dead sheeps. 9 men cutting horses
+ 3 horses. Latter part moderate breeze wind S. by S. +
S. by E. not a thing moving —

Tuesday Dec 18th 1843

the fore part a strong westerly wind. Latter
part wind backed in to the S. S. E. blowing fresh
yacht a number of fths — on different tacks

Wednesday Dec 19th 1843

the fore part fine S. S. E. moderate with a
heavy swell going. Latter part baffling wind
Course S. by E. Nothing in sight —
